More trouble for Kearny Police Department; transparency meeting planned

The Town of Kearny has been undergoing a series of changes with the local police department. One officer has been terminated, the interim chief remains on administrative leave pending investigation and another officer was arrested on domestic violence charges.

Many of the changes are sensitive in nature and some information can not be released to the public until all investigations are completed. To help local residents understand this process better there will be a meeting about Openness of Public Business and Transparency hosted by the Kearny Police Department. The meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, Aug. 12, 2015 at 6 p.m. The meeting will be held at Constitution Hall.

Last week KPD Officer Mata was arrested in Tucson for domestic violence charges and stalking. He was

arrested and given a \$7,500 bond. He is currently on administrative leave from his position with KPD pending the outcome of the criminal investigation.

On Monday, Aug. 3, Officer Van Buskirk was terminated from his position at KPD. Due to privacy involving personnel matters the Town could not provide detailed information on why he was terminated from this position.

There is still an ongoing investigation on Interim Chief Richard Corso. The investigation is being conducted by the Department of Public Safety Special Investigation Unit.

DPS Sgt. David Blue is serving the position as police chief pending the outcome of the investigation of Chief Corso. He explained to the Copper Basin News that all three matters are separate and are not connected to each other. He encourages the public to attend the community meeting on public transparency.

Kearny discusses water rate increase to help with repairs

Like many small towns, the Town of Kearny is faced with an aging water system and the question of how to pay for much needed repairs.

A recent water rate study conducted for the Town of Kearny by the Phoenix-based firm NCS Engineers revealed some areas of concern for future planning.

A consultant with NCS explained to the council at a meeting held late last month that utility funds should be fully funded by the rates paid by customers and general funds from the municipality should not have to be used to fund the management and maintenance of utilities.

For small towns in the area, the consultant said, rate increases have not occurred over the years but the ongoing need for maintenance on aging water systems continue to increase. As the municipal utility systems age, the costs to maintain and make needed repairs increase.

Kearny's situation also requires the council to plan in advance to pay for Central Arizona Project water should there not be enough water distributed to Kearny through the Globe Equity Water District each year. In years of extreme drought, the Globe Equity Water district could limit the amount of water given to Kearny from the Gila River. Should that happen the town will need to utilize water from the CAP allocation. In order to access those waters the town will need to have funds available to buy the water from CAP.

Currently the council is working on repairs to the existing filtration system

that will help keep the manganese out of the water. There have been some delays in the repair construction process. Some residents in Kearny are experiencing dark water due to the manganese in the water. Town Manager, Anna Flores explained that this has been a problem for a long time in Kearny due to the proximity of the town to the Gila River and the aging water pipes. The rate increases will help to further improve the water systems.

The Council had two options to discuss in which to fund the needed improvements and ongoing maintenance to the water system. Option one was a reallocation of 40 percent of the Central Arizona Water facility fee in the 2015-16 budget year. This would require an increase to 80 percent for the 2016-17 budget. This would still allow for 20 percent of the fees to be used for the CAP facility fee should the CAP water be needed in a drought year. Consultants to the town explained that they plan on a drought to occur every 10 years.

The second option was to increase the per month fee by \$2.50 for every customer for the 2015-16 year with an additional increase of \$2.50 for a total of \$5.00 additional fee for budget years 2016-17 through the 2019-20 budget year.

After much discussion on the funding mechanisms for the repairs and ongoing maintenance, the council voted to combine the two options by raising the fee by \$2.50 per month for the first year and then allocating the CAP funds for the second year. The council will need to host a public hearing in order to enact the rate increase. At press time the date and time of the hearing has not been selected; it is expected to be in September.

Nomination for Oak Flats Historic Site designation returned

This week Copper Area News received numerous phone calls from readers claiming that the nomination application for Oak Flats to become a historic site was not returned and was still under review with the Keeper of the Record at the National Parks Service. These callers did not disclose which department at the Tonto National Forest Service was reporting this information. These claims were further researched and the original story remains

intact.

In an interview with Paul Lusignan, a historian with the National Register of Historic Places, it was confirmed that the nomination application for "Chil Bildagoteel" (Oak Flats) was returned to the Regional Preservation Office, and the application was no longer under consideration. A letter was also sent confirming the return of the application to the Federal Preservation Office. It is the responsibility of the Regional Preservation Office to return the application to the Tonto National Forest. At this time it is unconfirmed if the Tonto National Forest has actually received the comments from the Keeper on the returned application.

Historic and cultural designation nomination applications are approved through the Keeper of the Record through the National Park Service. The nominations are required to go through several levels of state and federal government before they are approved or denied by the Keeper of the Record. Nominations that are returned are not listed online, only the applications that are approved for these designations are listed on the Park Service website.

Lusignan also explained that the even though the original nomination was returned for technical reasons, it can be re-submitted by the Forest Service should they decide to resubmit their application.

Gila County adopts budget for 2015-16

(GLOBE, AZ)— At a special meeting on July 28, the Gila County Board of Supervisors adopted a FY 2015/2016 Budget that holds the tax rate level for the sixth consecutive year. Faced with ongoing impacts from the state budget and the uncertainty of historical federal revenues, the Supervisors are relieved to have been able to keep the tax rate at \$4.19 and adopt a budget that is nearly \$2.5M less than the preceding fiscal year, while absorbing mounting state mandated costs and cost shifts to the County. The Gila County budget reflects a primary property tax levy that is \$8.8M below the maximum tax levy.

Chairman of the Board/District II Supervisor, Michael A. Pastor, believes that “the budget is conservative and reflects necessities, not wants, but also funds a strong criminal justice system, addresses the County’s long-term infrastructure requirements and provides quality services to constituents.”

Over 58 percent of the County’s General Fund Budget is dedicated to criminal justice, which includes, the Sheriff and Constables; Superior and Justice Courts; County attorney; and, Adult and Juvenile Probation. Gila County is committed to

Gila County offers 2015 senior property valuation protection

It’s good news for Gila County seniors.

The Gila County Assessor Deborah Hughes has announced a program for senior citizens that would freeze the limited property value of a primary residence.

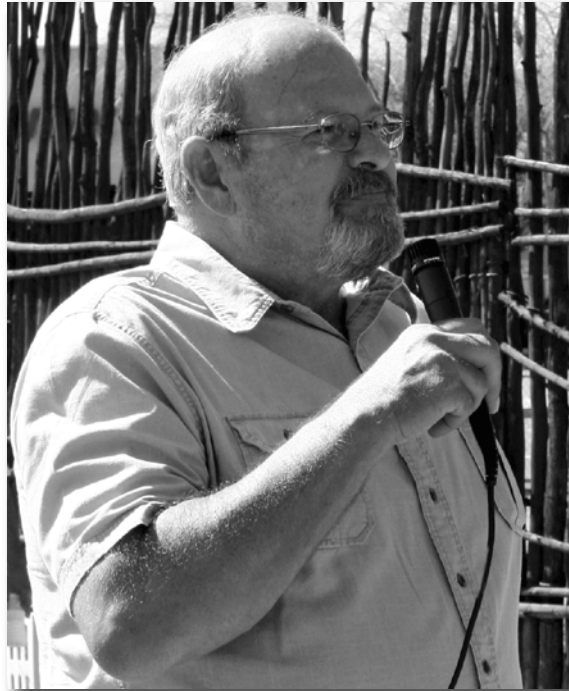
While the limited property value is frozen, the taxes are not levied at the same rate as all other properties in the taxing district. To qualify, the owner must be a senior, age 65 or over who has resided in the primary residence for at least two years prior to application. Primary Residence is defined as the residence which is occupied by the taxpayer for nine months of the calendar year. If the primary residence is a mobile home (personal property), the applicant’s name must be on the title of the property. Owner must fill out the application. At least one of the two owners must be 65 years of age. Proof of age is required.

All income, taxable and non-taxable, of all owners is used to determine eligibility. This income must be verified for three years prior to the year in which the freeze becomes effective. Total three year average income cannot exceed the following limits for 2015: \$35,184 for one owner, \$43,980 for two or more owners.

Applications are accepted through Sept. 1 of each year, so time is of the essence for those who are interested in applying. To remain eligible, the owner is required to renew every three years. The Assessor’s Office mails out renewal applications in the renewal year.

The County moves into the new fiscal year with just over 28 fewer budgeted employees. The Supervisors credited elected officials and department heads for their ongoing cooperation and willingness to practice prudent management and spending.

The adopted budget includes provisions for the County’s continuing commitment to increased security for the benefit of the public and its employees. Ongoing projects will eliminate leased facilities and relocate scattered programs into more productive and efficient groupings. This budget also provides initial funding to reserve for technology infrastructure and further move to the virtual computing environment.

Vice-Chairman/District I Supervisor Tommie Cline Martin, while pleased overall with the County’s solid financial condition, in spite of state imposed cost shifts and unfunded mandates, is gratified to see infrastructure being addressed county-wide. “Northern Gila County constituents have for many years dealt with a crowded and awkward County complex. If plans for the Payson area come to fruition, they indicate a fairly quick need for a better design for increased services. Recent acquisition of an adjacent retail space will begin to provide much needed space to house County services and ease congestion. While this is only a beginning, it is a beginning.” Supervisor Martin is also pleased

that the budget addresses the Board's commitment to Community Agencies, Economic Development, Community Colleges, and Natural Resources.

Board Member and District III Supervisor John D. Marcanti said that the budget was developed to be sustainable and structurally balanced. He pointed out, "the assessed property values have declined steadily since FY 11/12, but that for the coming fiscal year an increase primarily in centrally valued properties has resulted in an increase that nears the values of FY 13/14." He expressed his hope that this will become a trend in the coming years in the recovery of overall local, state and national economies.

The budget process this year included two public forums held between the adoption of the tentative and final budgets for the residents to learn more about the budget, ask questions, and provide comments.
