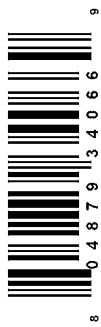

Nomination for Oak Flats Historic Site designation returned

This week Copper Area News received numerous phone calls from readers claiming that the nomination application for Oak Flats to become a historic site was not returned and was still under review with the Keeper of the Record at the National Parks Service. These callers did not disclose which department at the Tonto National Forest Service was reporting this information. These claims were further researched and the original story remains intact.

In an interview with Paul Lusignan, a historian with the National Register of Historic Places, it was confirmed that the nomination application for "Chi' chil Bildagoteel" (Oak Flats) was returned to the Regional Preservation Office, and the application was no longer under consideration. A letter was also sent confirming the return of the application to the Federal Preservation Office. It is the responsibility of the Regional Preservation Office to return the application to the Tonto National Forest. At this time it is unconfirmed if the Tonto National Forest has actually received the comments from the Keeper on the returned application.

Historic and cultural designation nomination

applications are approved through the Keeper of the Record through the National Park Service. The nominations are required to go through several levels of state and federal government before they are approved or denied by the Keeper of the Record. Nominations that are returned are not listed online, only the applications that are approved for these designations are listed on the Park Service website.

Lusignan also explained that the even though the original nomination was returned for technical reasons, it can be re-submitted by the Forest Service should they decide to resubmit their application.

Legends of Superior Trail hike offered during annual Prickly Pear Fest

Get an early start on the Prickly Pear Festival by joining Steward of the Legends of Superior Trail's Bill Vogler for a hike to Pinal City on the LOST Trail at 6:30 a.m. on Saturday, Aug. 22.

Participants will meet at the Superior Airport and hike a mile (plus) to the old Pinal City ruins.

Pinal City is where Superior got its roots during the 1870's and 1880's when it was a boisterous silver mining town that processed the silver ore from the old Silver King Mine. There are still foundations and evidence there indicating what a vibrant place it once was, now lost under the summer sun and mesquite trees.

The LOST Trail has recently become incorporated into the Legends of Superior Trails, Inc. and is a 501(c)(3) non-profit tax exempt organization. It is accepting founding members into its organization which hopes to develop, maintain and restore trail systems in the Superior area and give residents and visitors an area to enjoy as well as a look into Superior's historical past.
