Kearny Town Manager runs for La Paz County Supervisor

During the Spring of 2020, the Kearny Town Council voted to hire Jeff McCormick as the new Town Manager to replace Anna Flores who retired from the Town of Kearny at the end of May.

In recent weeks, *Copper Basin News* was contacted by the *Havasun* on the employment status of Mr. McCormick. McCormick accepted full time employment with Town of Kearny, despite the fact

that he had met all of the nomination requirements to be a candidate for the La Paz County Board of Supervisors.

McCormick came to Kearny after holding a position with the La Paz County development services, a position from which he was terminated. On his campaign website (<https://www.mccormickforlapaz.com>), McCormick contends that he was terminated because

La Paz County refused to follow national building code and, in his position, he was required to enforce those building codes.

Within the past two weeks, according to the *Havasun*, McCormick mailed a campaign flyer to voters

in La Paz County, asking them to contact the La Paz County Recorder if they want to change their vote.

Copper Basin News has sent numerous emails to Mr. McCormick to do a profile article and also for comment on his campaign

for La Paz County Board of Supervisors. McCormick did not respond to any of our inquiries. McCormick was running in a contested primary and at press time the results of the La Paz County elections were not available.

Voucher increase announced by Supervisor Rios

Supervisor Pete Rios is proud to announce the increase of dump vouchers for Eastern Pinal County residents from 3 to 6 per calendar year.

"I continually advocate for these services in the Eastern communities. The vouchers are free to Pinal County residents and I highly encourage everyone to take advantage of them. I also hope it encourages people to not partake in wildcat dumping and care for our land," said Supervisor Rios.

Residents are reminded that in order to obtain vouchers they must present the supervisor's office with a current utility bill that includes name and physical address. Please note that vouchers will not be issued without proper documentation. Those individuals who own more than one residence may only obtain vouchers for their primary residence. Vouchers are redeemable at the Oracle Transfer or the NEW Dudleyville Transfer. Vouchers will be issued according to the name that appears on the utility bill and that person must be present when redeeming the vouchers.

These additional vouchers can be obtained at the Mammoth County Complex located at 118 Catalina Ave. or by contacting Supervisor Rios' office at 520-866-7830 for other options.

The Dudleyville landfill's projected date of closure is Aug. 10.

Following the landfill closure the projected opening of the new transfer station on Aug. 14.

The proposed hours of operations will be every Friday and Saturday 8 a.m. to 4 p.m.

CVIT Remembers Superintendent Pete Guzman

With a broken heart the staff of Cobre Valley Institute of Technology announces the passing of Superintendent Pete Guzman on Wednesday July 1, 2020.

Superintendent Pete Guzman was one of the founding fathers of CVIT in 2000, as the Superintendent at the origination of the District. It was Pete's vision to make CVIT what it is today. Under his leadership CVIT was formed as a career and technology district with Miami, Hayden and Superior High Schools. San Carlos joined CVIT in 2006, Globe in 2008 and finally Ray High School in 2016. CVIT was Pete's heart and soul and he worked

hard to bring opportunities of free career and technical education to high school students in the Copper Corridor. Today CVIT has career and technical education programs in each member high school and sends its students to two community colleges (CAC and EAC) for college level, industry certified instruction so they are truly work and/or college ready after high school graduation.

Pete was a lifelong resident of Arizona. He was born and raised in Hayden, where his career in education began. He was a teacher, coach, athletic director and a K-8 principal from years 1973-2001. From 2002-2013, Mr. Guzman was also the Superintendent for Superior Unified School District. Pete's honors and awards include but are not limited to: Arizona School Boards Association Superintendent of the Year (2007); All-Arizona Superintendent Award from Arizona School Administrators (2006); Certificate of Recognition from American Red Cross (1993); All-Arizona Hispanic Coach of the Year (1992); Arizona Coaches Association; All-Star Coach (1985, 1986, 1988); Arizona Coach of the Year from Arizona Coaches Association (1988); and All-Star Basketball Coach from Arizona Coaches Association (1983).

Pete Guzman was an extraordinary visionary in education. Above all he was an exceptional human being. One could not go out in public with Pete – have lunch at a local restaurant, etc. – without several people stopping by to say hi and thank him

for what he did for them. He left his mark on students, teachers, and staff wherever he was. His big heart, integrity and compassion was next to none. He treated his employees with respect and care; he made everyone feel important and a part of a team. He surrounded himself with good, student-oriented people and when in doubt he would always ask, "How does this benefit students?" His management style brought him a lot of respect and admiration from students, coworkers, and the community at large.

CVIT's former Executive Program Director Beata Tarasiuk remembers Pete Guzman as a person of extraordinary integrity and passion for education.

"He always believed in me and allowed me to reach for the stars in my professional career. It is a mark of a great leader to allow his employees to shine. He left a legacy of kindness excellence. I still have his words sounding in my head: 'If you need me, call me anytime,' and he always answered the phone," Beata said.

Former Administrative Assistant Rachel Cardenas had this to say: "Mr. Guzman was considerate, courteous and very devoted to his profession and family. It was an honor to have worked with him."

Business Manager Donna Roach said, "He was more than just a boss, he was a friend. He always had time to listen, and had plenty of life stories and experiences to share. His passion for CVIT was the engine that pushed him forward."

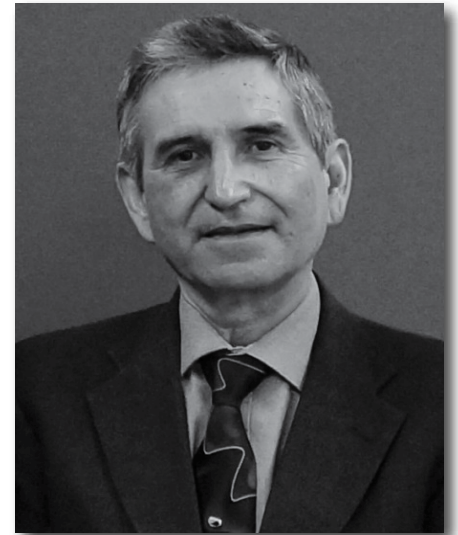
Mike O'Neal, the Interim Superintendent, said one of his biggest takeaways from working with and being mentored by Pete for the last four years was that if Pete believed it was in the best interest of kids, he was going to do everything within his power to make it happen.

"The impacts Pete has had on lives of students within the copper corridor are immeasurable, and he will be greatly missed," he added.

Franceen Gregovich-Benton, one of CVIT's Founding Board Members and longtime friend and colleague, said: "Pete was so devoted to education and I learned so much from him. He was such a calming influence. I would be worked up about something and he could calm me down and have me look at the bigger picture. He would say to me, 'It will be fine Fran, don't worry.' He was a true blessing to CVIT and me."

Board Member Yvonne Lees remembers Pete as a lifelong educator and visionary.

"Pete was always trying to bring new

education opportunities to our region. He was excited to include San Carlos High School in CVIT, he knew that students would benefit from a variety of programs," she noted.

Mike Fane, CVIT's Board Chairman, remembers Pete Guzman as devoted leader and a lifetime coach.

"We often talked about high school sports," Mike said. "Pete had a true passion for sportsmanship and student education and development through team building. He was a coach in his heart throughout his career in education."

"Mr. Pete Guzman was an exemplary leader," said Anna Flores, Vice Board Chairman. "I served under his phenomenal leadership as the School Counselor when he served as the Superintendent and Principal of the Superior Unified School District. I also worked with Mr. Guzman as a CVIT School Board Member. Mr. Guzman made a significant impact in my life regarding his love for students and staff. He made a difference in the lives of everyone he came in contact with. Mr. Guzman's tireless dedication to education made him a class act. He had a firm belief in holding high expectations for all students while meeting their unique needs and supporting their academic success. Mr. Guzman understood that this is a daunting challenge that educators face each day so valuing and appreciating teachers and school staff were one of his highest priorities. He met challenges regarding education, head-on. He truly gave his heart and soul to his family and

Board Member Maria Munoz says: "I am deeply saddened with the loss of Mr. Guzman. He touched so many lives, mentored so many people and guided many through the path of wisdom. His vision and passion for education will continue through our efforts!"

There are a lot of people in mourning right now. Each one of us can tell their personal story of Pete's impact on their life. Pete was a man who cared deeply about the people in his life and community. As Mother Teresa said, "It is not how much we give, but how much love we put into the giving." He will not be forgotten. Pete Guzman lives in our hearts forever and his teachings will be passed through generations.

Ray Bearcats Parent-Teacher Organization: support for teachers and students in unprecedented times

If you are looking for help or looking to help enhance and support the educational experience of students at Ray USD, contacting Ray Bearcats Parent-Teacher Organization is likely to be the best choice you could make.

Through volunteering and encouraging parental environment, this stand-alone non-profit organization of parents and teachers has gone above and beyond in offering support, organization and entertainment within the Kearny community. Sadly, with COVID-19 changing so much of how things are done, when, where, how and why, attendance of interested volunteers at meetings is down. To combat this, Ray Bearcats PTO have been making changes with meeting schedules and have settled on, for now and the foreseeable future, a virtual format meeting held on the last Monday of each month at 7 p.m.

Ray Bearcats PTO, begun during the 2019-2020 school year, does its best to offer support for the whole community by working with local businesses in decorating for school spirit, helping the school communicate important messages through social media, and, helping parents and students to navigate these new turbulent times when there is so much seeming disparity between what is considered best for the students by the parents and by the schools.

During its first year Ray Bearcat PTO became an official business, separate from the school and recognized as a nonprofit organization both by the State of Arizona and by the Federal government.

Ray Bearcat Parent-Teacher Organization President Melissa Day stated, "During our first year, our biggest and best accomplishment was the donation of funds from Empire Southwest LLC to purchase four brand new water fountains for our school. These water fountains are located in the Elementary school cafeteria, the High School office, the High School gym, and the HS weight room. The indoor fountains are different from the rest in that they are filtered and refrigerated. We really want to acknowledge that business for donating the funds to our organization."

Coppernet, Norm's IGA and The Town of Kearny donated to Ray Bearcat PTO directly to provide start-up funds, enabling the purchase of insurance. Without their help, as well as that which came from others in the community the 'Bucks for Bearcats' fundraiser would not have been the success it turned out to be, allowing Ray Bearcat PTO to do so much early in the school year.

There was the Junior High Orientation which included a funny video made by Mrs. Warren and family, plus a scavenger hunt designed to help the new Junior High students learn the layout of the campus. Also, the photo booth on the first day of school, which featured signs made by an active and artistic Ray Bearcat parent. During the Krispy Fundraising Ray Bearcats PTO assisted in helping the schools hit an all time record total of over \$2000 in sales. Those funds help supply the Elementary School P.A.W. Store. The PTO also assisted the school staff in the Box Tops for Education fundraising where an all time record high of over \$400 was reached. Those funds will also be used to supply items in the P.A.W. Store. This is a small sampling of the activities that Ray Bearcats PTO initiated or significantly participated in.

The current fundraiser, ending Wednesday, Aug. 5, is to raise money to purchase each student who is enrolled, a Ray USD Bearcat Mask. There is an option to purchase a mask for yourself to show your hometown spirit and to donate a mask to a student upon checkout, as a means of donating to the fundraiser and helping reach the goal of each student having a mask at no cost to them.

Board Members who made the first year a success are VP-Ginger Bentley, Treasurer-Leah Wade, Recording Secretary-Nadean McCubbin, Communications Secretary-Ericka Granillo, and HS Teacher Representative-Roxanna Fuerstenberg. New board members are President-Melissa Day, VP-Jana Fuller, Treasurer -Jannae Yslas-Roach, Communications Secretary-Jeri Garcia, and HS Teacher Representative-Roxanna Fuerstenberg. There is a need of a Recording Secretary at this time.

Copper Area News is committed to providing our readers with as much information as possible. We post a daily update on our Facebook page with the total positive COVID-19 Data. This graph shows the daily counts of positive cases for the past week as of press time on Aug. 4, 2020.

There are a few points we would like our readers to consider when following this data.

1. This will continue to be a rolling total of positive cases. It does not reflect recoveries or deaths. The Arizona Department of Health Services does not break out this data.
2. If you see a reduction in numbers from day to day it is most likely due to a data entry error or mis-coding of a zip code (at the state level).
3. This is all zip code based data; most of our zip codes include unincorporated areas. There is no way to track exactly which areas each of the positive cases are. Example, Kearny and Winkelman each have small communities in their zip code that are not in the Town's incorporated boundaries.
4. If you live in Gila County, please follow the Gila County Health and Emergency Management, Facebook. They have maintained their data on recoveries and current positive cases.

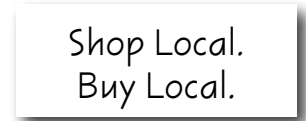
