The deadline to turn in your paperwork to run for school district and GCC governing boards is 5 p.m. on Wednesday, Aug. 6! Forms can be downloaded at [www.gilacountyschools.org](http://www.gilacountyschools.org).

Signed petitions and affidavits of qualification must be filed with the Gila County Superintendent of Schools Office (located in Globe at 1400 E. Ash Street) or the Elections Department (located at 5515 Apache Ave in Central Heights).

Governing board seats up for election include two four year seats in the Globe Unified School District; two four year seats and one two year seat in the Hayden-

Winkelman Unified School District; two four year seats in the Miami Unified School District; three four year seats and one two year seat in the San Carlos Unified School District; and two four year seats in the Whiteriver Unified School District. In the Globe-Miami area, the Gila Community College has one two year seat in District 4 and one six year seat in District 3 up for election. The CVIT Governing Board also has the following seats up for election: one four year seat in District 2-Globe, one four year seat in District 2-Miami, one two year seat in District 2-San Carlos, and one four year seat in District 2-Superior.

# Three Pinal County school districts are seeking override extensions in Nov. 4 election

Three school districts in Pinal County will be asking voters to approve tax overrides to support their maintenance and operations budgets on Nov. 4.

Both the Oracle Elementary School District and the Superior Unified School District has filed for 15 percent overrides while the Ray Unified School District based in Kearny is seeking a 10 percent override. Under Arizona law, individual school districts can seek voter approval through property taxes additional funding equivalent to up to 15 percent more than is allocated in the state budget approved by the state legislature.

Of the three districts, the most energized is the Oracle Elementary School District, which in 2013 came only 52 votes short of approving a 15 percent override.

"Oracle needs the full override funding to maintain the current level of instructional programs. Since the heartbreaking loss in 2013 we had to trim the budget by nearly \$154,000 for the upcoming school year and, without a reauthorization of the 15 percent override we might have cut deeper, which would affect some of educational programs," said Dennis Blauser, superintendent of Oracle Elementary.

To put the override over the top this year, the district is casting a wider net in search of voters. Pitches for the override have already been delivered before a meeting of

the local Republican and Democrat parties and to the local Rotary Club. An independent political action committee called SOS (Support Our Schools) has been organized by citizen Jana Looby that is currently fundraising to support efforts to promote the override in the fall.

"We will be canvassing door to door, making phone calls and passing out leaflets to get the word out that without reauthorization of the full 15 percent override some educational programs might be lost," Looby said. "We'll be meeting with church and other groups, with special emphasis on the SaddleBrooke and SaddleBrooke Ranch communities where we feel the extra votes can be found."

"Every effort to broaden support for Oracle schools will be attempted," Blauser promised.

Blauser emphasized that approval of the override is simply a continuation of the existing override so there will be no increase in property taxes. The school part of the local property tax is only about 24 cents per \$100,000 of property valuation.

Superior Unified School District (SUSD) is likewise seeking continuation of its existing 15 percent override.

"We are in our fifth year of the current override, so we are going to the voters to keep it 15 percent," said SUSD Superintendent Patrick O'Donnell. "Otherwise beginning in 2015 we'll have to start trimming the maintenance and operations budget."

Under Arizona law, overrides are authorized by voters for only seven years. If not approved for another full term after the fifth year, the tax override is reduced by one-third in the sixth year, two-thirds in the seventh year, and reaches zero in the eighth year.

To promote approval of the override referendum, at least one citizens group has been formed to take the message to



citizens throughout the district. A major tool of his group is a slide show promoting the value of education and how it benefits the community – and how cutbacks in instruction

# State releases school letter grades – how did the Copper Corridor Schools fare?

Just as students receive report cards tracking their progress throughout a school year, so too do schools receive grades.

The Arizona Department of Education assigns each school district and each school within the district a letter grade A-F based on the weighting of student performance on the AIMS tests and student academic growth from year to year, along with additional points for high English Language Learner reclassifications and significant reductions in dropout rates. This report card reflects the school's and district's annual academic profile.

Approximately 75 more schools across the state earned "A" letter grades when compared to last year. At the same time, the number of schools receiving a grade of B, C, or D fell. "The majority of Arizona schools are doing quite well," said Superintendent of Public Instruction John Huppenthal Monday at a press conference. Sixty-five percent of schools are receiving A or B labels. "Arizona's schools are improving. In fact, we found over 20% schools improved a letter grade over last year," he said.

Among the Copper Corridor school districts, one showed improvement over 2013, two maintained the same grades and two dropped a letter grade. District grades are an average of the school grades.

Hayden-Winkelman Unified School District brought 2013's "D" up a letter grade to a "C." Winkelman

Elementary School dropped its overall grade from a "C" last year to a "D" this year. Leonor Hambly Middle School (Hayden Junior High) showed improvement, bringing its 2013 "D" to a "C." Hayden High School maintained its "C."

Ray Unified School District and Oracle Elementary School District maintained their letter grades from 2013. Both are sporting "C" averages.

In the Ray District, Ray Elementary School (K-6) dropped its "C" grade from 2013 to a "D" in 2014. Ray Junior-Senior High School last year was given two grades, one for the junior high and one for the senior high. Both schools were awarded a "C" and this year, though combined, maintained that grade.

In the Oracle School District, only one school is graded, Mountain Vista School (Oracle Ridge School is a kindergarten only school and is not tested; it received only a "Pass" grade). Mountain Vista kept its "C" grade from 2013.

Mammoth-San Manuel Unified School District and Superior Unified School District both dropped a letter grade overall. Mammoth-San Manuel dropped from a "B" last year to a "C" this year, while Superior dropped from a "C" to a "D."

Two schools within the M-SM School District contributed to the district's grade drop, San Manuel Junior High and, surprisingly, Mammoth Elementary STEM School. SMJHS's grade dipped to a "D" while the MESS grade slipped from a "B" to a "C." First Avenue Elementary and San Manuel High School remained static at "C."

Superior School District was the only school in the Copper Corridor to receive a "D" grade overall, which overshadows the fact it has the only high school in the area to receive a "B," an improvement over last year's "C."

John F. Kennedy Elementary School's grade dropped from its 2013 "C" to a "D" while Superior Junior High saw no improvement over last year's "D."

The Copper Corridor's only charter school, Sierra Oaks Community School (which announced in May that it would be closing its doors) also saw an improvement over the previous year. In 2013, the school's overall grade was a "D." This year's grade was a "C." Officials from Sierra Oaks cited a lack of enrollment and state funding as the cause for the school's demise.

# Bearcats start football season

It's that time of the year, time for school to start, monsoons, 100-plus degree temperatures, and football. Bearcats' head coach Willie Jordan had his team on the field Monday for the first official practice of the 2014 season.

"Summer is over and those players who participated in football camp will have an advantage," Jordan said in advance of the start of the season. "We will see who has the stamina and the work ethic to fill in the rest of the roster."

Jordan, who was named the Division VI, Section IV Coach of the Year returns for his fourth season leading the Bearcats' program. His coaching staff from last year returns as well and includes assistants Jason Wernett, Jimmy Fessenden, Freddy Cruz, and Michael Hing.

"These dedicated individuals donate their time and energy to teaching our student-athletes to believe in themselves with an understanding that hard work will make them better players," Jordan said in an email to the Copper Basin News.

The Bearcats enter the 2014 season with high expectations

after going 8 – 2 and reaching the quarterfinals of the state playoffs in 2013. Returning players Destry Yocum, Seth Harmon, Jacob Pace, and Robbin Newman earned All-Section honors in 2013. This quartet figures to lead a Bearcats' team looking to replace 12 players who graduated, including 2013 Section IV Player of the Year Dominic Bravo.

Replacing a large number of players off last year's roster may present the biggest challenge for Jordan and his staff. It's a task made more difficult without a JV program to draw from. Developing a reliable receiving corps and a strong group of running backs will be a priority during fall camp.

"The development of the underclassmen from this school year and beyond will have an impact on the years to come," Jordan said.

Yocum is one of the top returning signal callers in the state and will be counted on by the coaching staff to help the Bearcats' achieve their season's goals. Harmon will pull double-duty on offense, playing receiver and fullback. Pace, the lone returning senior lineman, also serves as the team's

kicker. Newman, a running back, led the Bearcats in rushing in 2013. Jordan is expecting seniors Jose Torres, Douglas McPeak, Steven Lucero, and Trison Gantt to have breakout seasons in 2014.

On defense, the Bearcats need playmakers to step up at the linebacker position and along the defensive line.

The running game on both sides of the ball should tell the tale for the Bearcats this season. If they are able to continue with their explosive running game on offense and can stop the run on defense, they should reach their goals in 2014.

**2014 Schedule Note:** Due to some schools not being able to field a team in 2013 (after originally declaring they could) and causing last minute cancellations, the AIA has decided to wait until AFTER the first week of practice before releasing the 2014 Division VI schedules. There may be some sectional realignment as well. The 2014 schedules, and any realignment, are expected to be released on August 8, 2014. The Copper Basin News will publish the schedules for the local schools as soon as they are available.

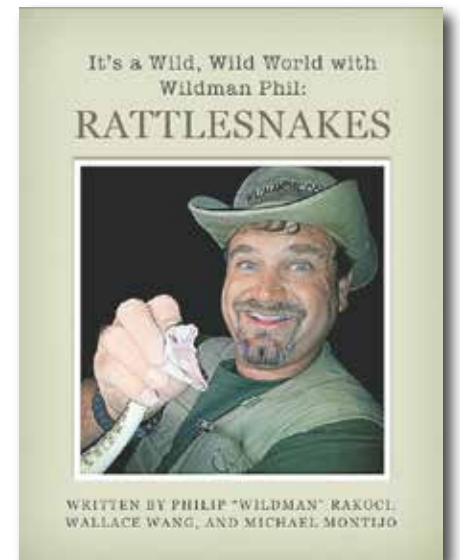

# When will students really win?

This Summer a Maricopa County Superior Court Judge ruled in the favor of Arizona students, and as quickly as our school districts won that judgement, legislative

leaders filed an appeal. Just like that, the fate of \$317 million technically owed to our students, is held up by the appeals process. Kind of sounds as if our legislative leaders and the governor have sentenced funding Arizona's students to death row.

How did the state end up owing this money to the schools? It's quite simple, when the "Great Recession" hit Arizona in 2007, the

Legislature decided that massive cuts needed to be made across the board, not just education, but everything from social services, tourism, and infrastructure, the list goes on and on of what was cut. These leaders nipped and tucked the state budget to rebuild a rainy day surplus and of course balance the budget, the budget balanced on a basis of fiscal conservatism. The

difference in the slashing of the education funding was that Arizona voters approved proposition 301 which guaranteed that per pupil funding would increase with inflation, when that voter approved mandate was not honored by the legislature and governor the bill added up to the tune of \$317 million dollars, not exactly chump change, by any means. It's fair to say that in reality the

funds were not there, the state was not receiving the revenues needed to fund everything and just like our own family bank accounts, the state can only use as much as they receive in revenue. The fact still remains that the voters of Arizona put funding education as a priority, one that was ignored by our leaders.

Per pupil funding prior to the "Great Recession" was \$3,776 per student, regardless

of the size of the district or its location, not to bad, right? If things would of went as planned with the inflationary increase our schools may have started to see some breathing room in their budgets, but with the slashing of the budgets schools today only receive \$3,376 per student, that is \$400 less now than it was in 2006. Yet our leaders continue to wonder why

programs can have an adverse effect – that will be presented at church and other meetings.

"Approval of the override also will help SUSD modify its loss of \$69,000 in Title 1 funds, provided as a federal grant to help students needing help in mastering reading," O'Donnell said. He added that if

the additional funding to school recently ordered by Maricopa County Judge Katherine Cooper were forthcoming, Superior would get an additional \$75,000 in state funding, which also would cover the Title 1 loss.

Approval of the override will keep the schools' share of the local

property tax at \$1.34 per \$100,000 property valuation.

The Ray Unified School District in Kearny is asking voters to approve a 10 percent tax override in November to keep from having to trim its budget and educational programs. A spokesperson for the district said Ray officials have

studied how school districts in Miami and Casa Grande promoted their override referendum to victory in 2013 and will try to do likewise.

Approval of the Ray override will keep the schools' share of the local property tax at \$1.06 per \$100,000 property valuation.

Arizona consistently ranks as one of the worst places for kids to grow up in.

This column wasn't written to bash any one political party or politician, but just a reminder, there is a few elections coming up. It was not written to persuade you that throwing money at a problem will fix it, we all know that does not necessarily work in any situation. I do hope it called your attention to the fact that the real crisis we will be facing soon is the lack of young adults and families in Arizona. While we are still raising kids in Arizona, as soon as they can grow up and leave they are gone, why? They are leaving because we lack jobs and opportunity, we lack an environment to raise the next generation of Arizonans. What company would really want to invest in Arizona when they know we are not investing in the infrastructure of the future, which is our children.

While districts across the state still have local control of their budgets, the reality is many of the mandates

and expectations are not funded adequately and our schools, make do with what they have. If there is one sector of employees that truly know how to do more with less it is those that have committed their life to education. Teachers double up on subjects taught, programs are cut, administrators cover multiple roles, they make it work despite the politics at the local, state and federal levels. We can only put a bandage on this situation for so long before we as a state must step up to the plate and really develop a broad plan to fund education pre-K through the university level that will give us a qualified workforce that will in itself attract a the jobs and economy we want. Ultimately the only way our students will win is when we take a hard look at how education is funded and when we commit that an educated work force is what will rebuild Arizona's economy so we can have the educational system our students deserve.
