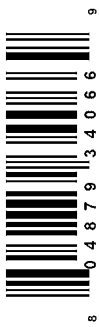

Preliminary work begins on the State Route 77 Gila River Bridge replacement project

Preliminary work is underway for the State Route 77 Gila River Bridge replacement project in Winkelman.

Over the next two weeks, crews will survey the work zone, install signs and complete other preparatory work.

No traffic impacts are expected at this time.

In late September, crews will install a temporary traffic signal. Once the signal is installed, traffic across the bridge will be restricted to a single lane. Drivers may only proceed across the bridge when the signal indicator shows green.

Motorists should expect occasional delays, especially during peak traffic hours and during scheduled closures of US 60 west of Miami for the Pinto Creek Bridge replacement project.

The temporary signal will allow crews to rebuild the bridge in sections.

In addition to the new bridge, the project includes new guard rails and pavement markings.

Work is expected to continue into the summer of 2021.

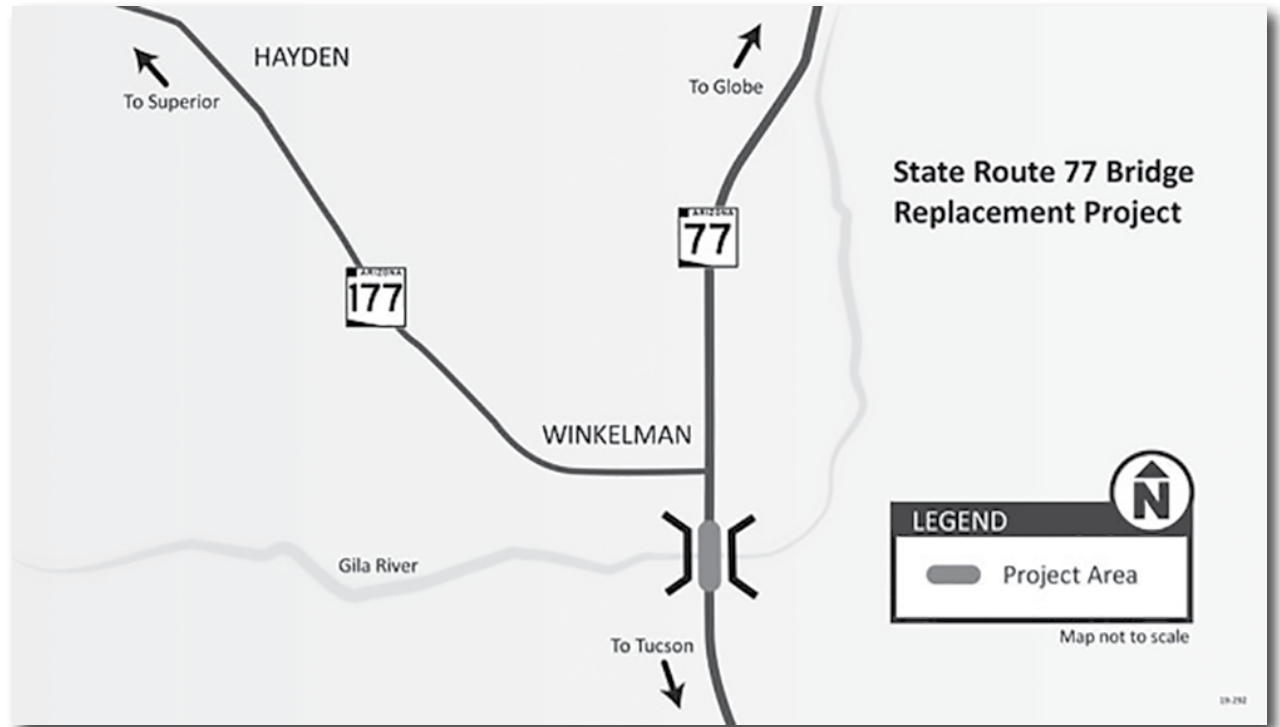
Drivers should proceed through the work zone with caution, slow down and watch for construction personnel and equipment.

Pack burro racing debuts in Arizona with the Superior Burro Run

On Oct. 12, 2019, the Superior Chamber of Commerce will sponsor the Superior Burro Run, the first BurroCross event in Arizona.

BurroCross is Arizona's adaptation of Pack Burro Racing, a sport that has been popular in Colorado for over 70 years. BurroCross involves "burros" (the Spanish term for donkeys) that are led in-hand by human cross-country trail runners, thus forming a unique human-burro team.

The Superior Burro Run will launch with a pre-run ceremony at 9 a.m. on E. Main Street in the historic mining town of Superior, where burros once roamed freely throughout town. The runners and their burros will then depart, traversing either a 6-mile introductory course or a 12-mile competitive course through Superior and the Tonto National Forest, before returning to the finish line on E. Main Street. Runners are required to pre-register and bring a burro. Spectators are encouraged to attend this exciting, family-friendly event, which will also feature a beer garden and vendors. The Bureau of Land Management (BLM) will also be set up just off Main Street with burros available to the public for sale or adoption. One may either adopt an untrained burro or purchase one that has been trained through the Inmate Training Program. Those interested in leaving the Superior Burro Run with a new burro should review the BLM facility and eligibility requirements in advance. <http://www.blm.gov/whb>

As a nod to the historic use of burros in mining, Pack Burro Racing began as a way to foster economic growth in Colorado's small mining towns. According to Monique Wylde Williams, who gentles wild BLM burros for public adoption and is the founder of Arizona BurroCross, Arizona is a prime candidate to adopt the quirky sport — the state produces more wild BLM burros than any other.

Traditionally, Pack Burro Racing requires the animals to carry a pack containing a pick, shovel and pan, with different weight requirements depending on the burro's size. BurroCross, on the other hand, allows packs but does not require them, and there is no weight requirement. Instead, BurroCross focuses on cooperation between the runners and their animals, as well as a competitive yet fun atmosphere that prioritizes the burro's welfare.

The Superior Burro Run is open to 50 participants and their animals. Burros of all sizes and types — ranging

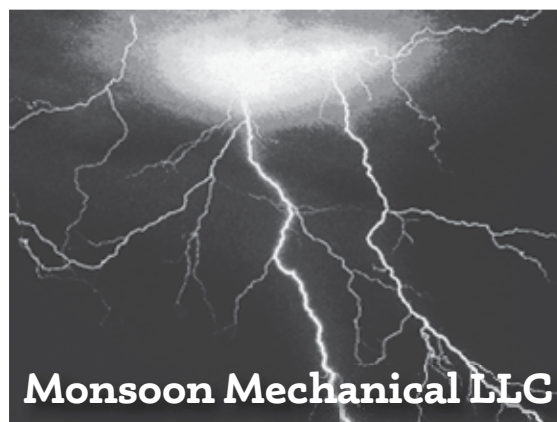

Bagdad ends Panthers' winning streak

Dating back to last season, the Superior football team entered last Friday's game at Bagdad riding a 12-game winning streak. Due partially to questionable circumstances, that streak ended following a 48 – 40 defeat in the Panthers' first road game of the year.

"I was really disappointed with our lack of execution," Superior head coach Ryan Palmer said afterwards. "We were faced with a lot of distractions and adversity; however, I take full responsibility for the loss. We weren't ready mentally to play that game.

"We beat ourselves with little mistakes that we normally do not make," he continued. "I told the team that was

Panthers roll to season-opening win

The Superior football team began the defense of its state championship with a performance reminiscent of many of its victories from a year ago, dominating Valley Union in the season opener for both teams on Friday, Aug. 30, 62 – 0.

"A shutout is a great way to start the season," Superior head coach Ryan Palmer told the *Superior Sun*. "The kids' hard work in the off season and in the weight room was put on display."

Junior Matthew Diaz-Gonzales, playing only half a game, scored five touchdowns in the win, including three receiving, one rushing and the last one a scoop-and-score

probably the poorest we have executed in four years, and we still had a chance to win, on the road, against the No. 2 team in the state."

Indeed, the Panthers did battle back from three scores down in the fourth quarter to make it a one-score game, with a chance to complete a remarkable comeback on their final possession.

"We came up just short, but I am so proud of the heart of these young men," Palmer said. "They had every reason to throw in the towel, but instead they rallied together and almost pulled off an incredible comeback."

Quarterback Matthew Cruz completed 16-of-35 passes for 233 yards and three touchdowns, one each to Sammy Lopez, Matthew Diaz-Gonzales and Adam Navarrette, who also scored a rushing touchdown and finished with a

fumble recovery. In all, he touched the ball six times and scored five times.

Sophomore quarterback Matthew Cruz, who was making his first start, completed 7-of-10 passes for 190 yards and three touchdowns. Junior Joshua Marquez along with seniors Sammy Lopez and Gabe Otero also scored offensively for the Panthers.

It was on the defensive side that the Panthers were even more impressive, recording nine turnovers – six interceptions and three fumble recoveries – and returning two for touchdowns. They also recorded seven sacks.

Lopez had three of the six interceptions, freshman Nick Mendoza had two, and Marquez added the other as well as a fumble recovery. Diaz-Gonzales and Gabe Castillo had

team-high 210 all-purpose yards.

Defensively, the Panthers scored twice, including a pick-six by Gabriel Otero and a fumble recovery by Daniel McConnell, who also had three tackles-for-loss and a sack in the game. Diaz-Gonzales led the team with 10 tackles while Navarrette finished with eight.

Despite the loss, Palmer believes his team gained some confidence in this game and expects his team to respond accordingly.

"This game was a wake-up call for us," he said. "There were flashes of brilliance muddled in with a lot of undisciplined play.

"We faced a lot of obstacles, but still found a way to have a chance to win in the end. If we execute and play responsible, assignment football, we have the potential to be as good, or better, than any team in 1A."

Up next: At Arete Prep on Friday, Sept. 13. Kickoff is scheduled for 7 p.m.

from mini to mammoth, formerly wild to domestic – are welcome to participate, but mules and horses are prohibited. While Arizona donkey rescues, such as Forever Home Donkey Rescue in Benson and Lucky A Ranch in Alpine, have a few trained burros to lend, runners are encouraged to borrow or bring their own. In order to run the competitive course, the burro must be at least three years of age. Younger burros may run or walk the introductory course. All burros must be at least two years of age. Prior to the event, runners will be able to camp overnight at the Box 8 Ranch in Superior. After the race begins and runners depart from E. Main Street, they will weave through the scenic

Tonto National Forest, past the historic "ghost townsite" of Pinal City and into the treasured Arnett Canyon via the Legends of Superior Trail (LOST).

Offering an intriguing course for runners and a festive atmosphere for spectators, the Superior Burro Run promises to be a fun and unique event for the whole family (burros are friendly and great with children!). The organizers of the race ask that spectators leave dogs and other animals at home. 1. Bids. The Town of Kearny will receive sealed Bids at the Town of Kearny, Town Hall, 912-C Tilbury Drive, Kearny, Arizona, 85137, telephone number, 520-363-5547, or questions for alfores@townofkearny.com, until 5:00 p.m., MST on Tuesday, September 17, 2019, when all Bids that have been duly received will be opened publicly. The project includes, but not necessarily limited to the following items of work:

105 acres of mechanical clearing of salt cedar in Kearny, Arizona. All six parcels are contiguous and treatment acres are located near the Gila River, but outside the active river channel. Treatment areas will occur on areas of dry sand, not in saturated soil. The overall scope of work of the project is to conduct mechanical fuels reduction treatments on six Town of Kearny parcels. Parcels range in size from just over 5 acres to 46 acres. Typical fuels on these parcels are mostly composed of native mesquite and non-native salt cedar along the Gila River floodplain.

Mechanical treatment will be grubbing done by using a dozer or front-end loader to uproot and push salt cedar trees out of the ground. Mastication will be done by machine, with a grinder implement to break up the trees and roots into mulch. The contractor should attempt to remove approximately 100 percent of salt cedar within the project boundary, taking care to ensure mastication and grubbing does not disrupt critical infrastructure within the boundary. Operations are expected to leave approximately 2-4 inches of wood chips from mastication on the ground in masticated areas, which will help with soil stability. One quote will be given as a standalone for the total 105 acres of the project block and the contractor shall provide all necessary equipment to complete the project. Project work will be completed by 2-11-20.
