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

The Sycamore Canyon Academy (SCA) has a new Program Director. Rite of







Miners drop fourth-straight game to start season

The San Manuel football team lost its fourth-straight game last Friday night against visiting Miami, 34 – 8.

Head coach Daniel Williams was not pleased following the loss.

"We have a lot to work on," Williams told the Miner. "We're not playing as a team and until we do we're not going to experience winning."

Junior running back Chrisitian Velasquez scored the Miners' lone touchdown on a

rushing play up the middle.

Last Friday was the third game in a row that the Miners have allowed 34 points or more. It was also the third game out of four that they were held to single-digit scoring.

With the halfway mark of the season approaching this week, the Miners need to make adjustments on both sides of the ball, and quickly, before the season's end arrives without a victory.

The Miners travel to Globe this Friday to take on the 3 - 1 Tigers. Kickoff is scheduled for 7 p.m.

The much larger Arizona College Prep team was large enough to put the maximum number of swimmers in each event against the small Miner team, so the outcome of the meet was never really in question from the time the visiting team got off the bus. The Miners were swimming to win races and improve times.

Wins were tough to find for the Boys. It was not until after the break Senior Michael Garcia won the 100 Butterfly. The only other win for the Boys Team was Senior Colbey Stratton winning the 100 Freestyle.

The Miner Girls did not back down and came out winning all 4 races before the break. The Medley Relay team of Freshman BaiLee Hill, Sophomore Gianna Sweeney, Sophomore Darien Apuron, and Junior Raya Woods won by a considerable margin. With very little rest between events, Raya Woods paced herself perfectly and came from behind to win the 200 Freestyle. Gianna Sweeney dominated the competition in the 200 Individual Medley to win by almost 30 seconds. In the always close 50 Freestyle, Sophomore Jasmine Smith was able to get her hand

on the wall first for the win. At the break, the Miners were up 31-29, and it was looking like they may be able to pull of the impossible win. To start off the second half of the meet, Darien Apuron won the 100 Butterfly, Gianna Sweeney won the 100 Freestyle, and Raya Woods won the 500 Freestyle. Since the top 5 places are scored, even though the Miners won the first 7 races, they found themselves down by a few points because of the great depth of the Arizona College Prep team. Darien Apuron won the 100 Backstroke which was the only Miner win in the final four events.

Raya Woods was named Dynamite Swimmer of the Meet. Her come from behind victory in the 200 Freestyle and outstanding swim in the grueling 500 Freestyle earned the respect of her teammates.

Despite the scores, the coaches were optimistic about the results. Miner swimmers had many personal best times and swimmers showed that they are good enough to compete with anyone.

Miner swimmers will travel to Florence on Thursday, Sept. 15, for a meet against Florence High School beginning at 4 p.m.

Tim's passion for challenging young men to better themselves, honed through his extensive training, finds expression in his work with Rite of Passage.

With only a month under his belt at Sycamore Canyon Academy, he is ambitious for the enterprise, his staff and his students. SaddleBrooke Community Outreach (SBCO) recently received over 400 knitted hats, destined for the SBCO Kids' Closet clothing program. Children in our 100 mile service area who are eligible to come to Kids' Closet may receive a fall and a spring wardrobe. The fall wardrobe includes a knitted hat to keep the kids warm while waiting for school buses. The hats are often created by local knitters and very much appreciated by the children.

A group of women, part of needlework club in the community of Sunflower in Marana, got out their needles and hooks and went to work. Their leader, Dawn, delivered over 400 hats to the SBCO office in the SaddleBrooke commercial center. Dawn was the creator of 320 of the hats, Carol stitched up 100, and several other participants donated their finished products to this project.

The fall wardrobe consists of 3 pairs of long pants, 3 shirts, 6 pairs of underwear and socks, a windbreaker, sneakers, hygiene items, reading books, and a hat! The youngsters are selected by their school administrators to participate in the program, based on need. They are generally bussed to the closet according to an established schedule. Each child is paired with an SBCO volunteer to select all the items for the wardrobe. All items are new;

the donation of hats helps keep the cost of an average fall wardrobe at \$75 per child.
