Michael Thomas Welfel



Michael Thomas Welfel passed away Aug. 23, 2020.

Michael was born Dec. 13, 1953 in New York City to father, Frederick John Welfel and mother, Gloria Cecilia Boland. After growing up in Spanish Harlem, he spent his younger years working as an auto mechanic in Massachusetts, a construction worker in Florida and

Arizona, and developed his love of travel while employed as a long-haul trucker, driving all over the southern United States.

He met and married his first wife, May Stillwell, in Phoenix, Arizona in 1980 and shortly thereafter, joined the Army. After the birth of their daughter, Nicole, they headed off to Germany. Unfortunately, May became sick and Mike was reassigned to a Recruiting Office in Colville, WA where May's family lived. She passed away there in January of 1989 and the following year he received an Honorable Discharge from the Army following a disabling injury.

Colville was a far cry from the bright lights of Manhattan, but this city boy quickly established himself as a successful businessman, owning and operating his own Vacuum Cleaner sales and repair shop, A-1 Distributing, for almost 20 years. During that time, he met Christine "KiKi" Johnson Pratt and they were married on Oct. 6, 1991. Mike sold his business and retired in 2008 due to health issues, and KiKi retired 5 years later. They promptly abandoned their snow shovels and headed south, snow-birding for 2 years in Arizona before making it official in 2015 when they purchased a home in Oracle.

Aside from being a self-made man, Mike was also extremely gifted in other vocations such as carpentry, welding, gardening, landscaping and home improvement projects. When he wasn't hunting or fishing, or riding his beloved Harley Davidson motorcycle all over the country, he was planning his and KiKi's next trip in their RV! He always said, "I have Gypsy in my blood!"

Michael's love of music was also evident in his life, and soon after moving to Oracle, he and KiKi became supporters of the Oracle Center for the Arts. He enjoyed meeting performers and sharing in the thrill of each concert with other music lovers. He loved watching the pianist's hands, so he often stood in the back so as not to miss anything! At his suggestion, a camera was installed to show the pianist's hands on an overhead screen so they could be seen from every seat.

Mike was member of American Legion Frank Starr Post #47 in Colville, WA, the NRA, and the American Motorcycle Association. He had a deep faith in God and was a devoted member of the Oracle Union Church, and lovingly made many charitable contributions, believing the words of Jesus, "Freely ye have received, freely give."

Michael is survived by his wife, KiKi; daughter, Nicole Welfel; brother, Fred Welfel (Liz); and sisters, Dottie Bellochio, Sharon Dunham (Wayne) and Patricia Welfel. He leaves behind stepchildren, (Kiki's children) Stephanie Hare (Jeremy) and granddaughter, Sophie; Travis Pratt (Kimberly) and grandson, Milo Pratt; and (May's children) Tom Kammers (Eve), Bob Kammers, Gary Walling (Shirley), and Susan Kammers. He is also survived by several nephews, nieces and step-grandchildren, and by his best friend, Stan Handley (Patty).

Mike lived a full life every single day, beginning each morning with a smile, a zest for living and never going to sleep without telling you his plans for his next adventure. In response to the question, "How are you?" he could often be heard saying, "I couldn't be better if there were two of me!" His quick smile and loving and generous spirit will live on in those of us who remember him.

3C Ranch celebrates restaurant reopens following pandemic shutdown

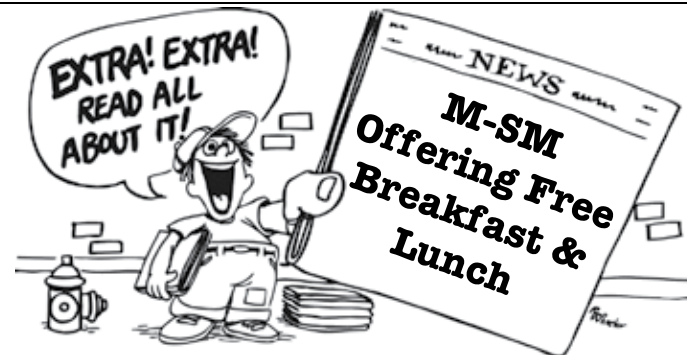
On Saturday and Sunday, Sept. 12 and 13, the 3C Ranch celebrated its grand reopening of its restaurant with a free barbecue dinner.

Robert Wayne 'Bonzai' Vickers

Copper Area News has received some articles from a former corrections officer from Arizona State Prison. This retired officer spent 25 years with the Arizona Department of Corrections working all custody levels from juvenile detention units to Death Row. The author wishes to remain anonymous. He hopes to provide the readers with a view of what it is like working with inmates and what life is like behind prison walls.

INTRODUCTION

The job of a corrections officer

is not easy. The nature of the job, working with men or women behind bars can be stressful. Working in high custody units can add to the stress. The Arizona Department of Corrections has a high staff turnover rate. One in five staff members quit within the first couple of years of being hired or use the training and experience they receive to transfer to Sheriff departments or Federal corrections.

Maximum custody inmates are either there because they are doing

long sentences, are convicted of violent crimes or they are problem inmates while in prison. Inmates on Death Row are under a sentence of death and have nothing to lose by acting out against staff or other inmates. Officers must always be on the alert to prevent these inmates from harming other inmates or staff. To understand the type of inmates that are housed on Death Row, I will provide you with a few of their stories, the crimes they committed and some of their prison life.



BEHIND THE WALLS

Stories from Arizona State Prison

Robert Wayne Vickers was not an imposing figure to look at. He was thin, standing six feet one inch and weighing 148 pounds. If you did not know his history, you would find it hard to believe that he was considered one of the most dangerous inmates in the Arizona State Prison system. Although Vickers had gained a reputation for violence while in Arizona juvenile institutions, it was not a violent crime that brought him to prison. He was 19 years old when sentenced to 3 to 9 years for grand theft for a series of burglaries committed in Tempe, Arizona. He arrived at the prison in Florence in 1977. He would not see freedom again.

When Vickers arrived at Florence, it was a time of extraordinary violence. In 1977 there had been 23 stabbings and seven murders at the Florence prison. He was still a teenager and may have felt he needed to engage in assaultive behavior to keep inmates away from him. He assaulted some black inmates probably in an attempt to impress the white racist prison gang "Aryan Brotherhood". In February of 1978, he stabbed Homer Burns with a shank (prison made weapon). He was convicted of assault with a deadly weapon and sentenced to 10 to 15 years. This set the stage for Vickers to earn his nickname and reputation.

Frank Ponciano was the 21-year-old cell mate of Robert Vickers. He was serving time for second degree murder. On Oct. 4, 1978, Ponciano failed to wake Vickers at lunch time and made the fatal mistake of drinking Vickers' Kool-Aid. Vickers strangled Ponciano with a knotted bed sheet and stabbed him 10 times in the back and side with a home made weapon. Vickers then used a toothbrush with a sharpened handle to carve the word "Bonzai" into the back of the dead Ponciano. Bonzai was the misspelling of Banzai, the Japanese patriotic cheer

or battle cry. From then on, the name Bonzai or Bonzai Bob would be used by inmates and staff when referring to Robert Vickers. After this, Vickers would sign his correspondence "Bonzai Bob" with a miniature swastika dotting the letter i.

Vickers was convicted of first degree murder and sentenced to death. He was the only inmate on Death Row for the murder of another inmate. At the trial it was brought out that corrections staff had missed finding Ponciano dead during at least one count. The death was not discovered until Vickers called over a corrections officer and told him to get Ponciano out of his cell. When the officer hesitated, Vickers shoved the burning end of a cigar into one of Ponciano's bare feet. When Ponciano did not react to his foot being burned, the officer called for back up.

In 1981, Vickers was scheduled for execution but a stay was granted by U.S. District Judge Carl Muecke. Vickers was angry because he had asked to be executed. Vickers told the press that he hoped someone "snuffs Judge Muecke's momma" and that he would carve the Judge's name on his next victim. The death penalty for Ponciano's murder would later be overturned and Vickers would be given a sentence of life in prison.

On March 4, 1982, Vickers was working as a porter cleaning a four-man pod area. The other three inmates were locked in their cells. Buster Holsinger, a fellow Death Row inmate, made a lewd comment about Vickers' teenage niece. Vickers had shown Holsinger a photograph of his niece and a drawing she had sent him in a letter. Holsinger then asked Vickers if he had ever performed a certain sex act on his niece. Vickers became infuriated and went back to his cell. He made a homemade incendiary device using an ice cream carton which he filled with five bottles

of Vitalis hair oil and tissue paper which he used as a fuse. He went to the front of Holsinger's cell, lit the oil and tossed the burning carton on Holsinger. When there were not enough flames to engulf the obese and invalid Holsinger, Vickers tossed more hair oil on him. Holsinger's cell became filled with smoke and flames as his mattress, bedding and other items caught on fire. Holsinger died from inhaling the hot fumes of the burning oil. The other two inmates were hospitalized for smoke inhalation. Vickers would be given another death sentence for Holsinger's murder.

Bonzai became well known for being able to slip out of handcuffs and for making and hiding weapons. Vickers assaulted 12 corrections officers and 20 inmates while in prison. He received disciplinary sanctions for 40 counts of making and possessing weapons. In 1986, Vickers managed to stab an officer in his lower side with a home-made spear. He made the weapon out of a sharpened piece of metal he had taken out of a typewriter. Vickers was in his cell at the time. The officer had just served Vickers his breakfast through a slot when Vickers stabbed him. He formed a 30 inches long handle out of tightly rolled and pasted newspapers.

Special security measures were taken with Vickers. Besides regular handcuffs, thumb cuffs were used whenever Vickers was removed from his cell. In Cell Block-6, a special "cage" was created and welded at the entrance of his regular cell. Vickers would have to enter the cage while nude. His regular cell would then be closed behind him. Officers would then visually inspect him for any weapons, handcuff keys or contraband. He would then be given clothes to put on. Officers would then cuff him, remove him from the cage and escort him to wherever he had to go. Vickers was moved from CB-6 to

the Special Management Unit, a super maximum custody unit. This unit would house the most troublesome inmates in the state.

On May 5, 1999, Robert Wayne "Bonzai Bob" Vickers was executed by lethal injection. His last meal included two green chile burritos, French fries with ketchup, vanilla ice cream, cream soda and one cigarette. There were no regrets from prison staff when Bonzai was finally executed except maybe why it took so long.

Hundreds expected to travel along Arizona Trail from Mexico to Utah in one day



Eight hundred miles is a long distance to attempt to drive in a day. If traveling by foot, bike, horse or any other self-powered means, it's impossible within 24 hours.

Or is it?

On Saturday, Oct. 10, hundreds of outdoor enthusiasts from across Arizona will cover one of over 100 separate sections of the Arizona National Scenic Trail (AZT), which extends from the Mexico border to the Utah border in an attempt to complete the entire trail in a single day. Each person will have a few miles to complete and 24 hours to do it.

The Trail is a Refuge

Despite countless large event cancellations throughout the summer and wildfire activity along the trail, the third annual AZT in a DAY remains in motion.

"The trail is open and welcomes you to practice social distancing while traveling through breathtaking landscapes," said Matthew Nelson, Executive Director of the Arizona Trail Association. "In times of uncertainty, the trail is a portal into a calmer, more beautiful reality."

AZT in a Day offers participants a way to be part of a large group of people working toward a common goal, spread out over 800 miles.

"It took tens of thousands of volunteers over three decades to build the Arizona Trail, and now we're delighted to be able to invite everyone to share this amazing public resource during one of the best times of the year. No matter how far you can hike, run or ride, we hope everyone can enjoy some time on the AZT throughout 2020 and especially on October 10 for AZT in a DAY," said Nelson.

Choosing Your Section

The 800-mile trail has been divided into sections ranging in length from 1.8 to 15.1 miles. Participants will have 24 hours to complete their portion of the trail. Online registration is free and open to everyone.

Participants can choose between desert, mountain, canyon, forest or urban segments of the trail. The AZT passes through eight wilderness areas, four National Forests, two National Parks, one National Memorial, one State Park, and

passes through or near 32 gateway communities.

"We advise participants be well-prepared. Some access points require 4-wheel drive or high clearance vehicles," said Karrie Kressler, Administrative Director.

A few sections of the trail are remote and require extra planning. For these sections, participants familiar with backpacking will be required to camp in particular areas at least a day before the actual event to be ready to complete their portion on Oct. 10, according to Kressler.

"So far, we have hikers, runners, bikers and equestrians booked for over 90% of the sections, but there are still sections that need to be covered," Nelson said.

This year will be especially challenging for participants, as COVID-19 recommendations discourage carpooling, traveling far from home, and gathering in large groups. This summer's wildfires have damaged over 100 miles of the AZT and several of these areas are not expected to be safe or ready to reopen this year.

Fundraising Opportunities

Participants who want to help raise money to support the Arizona Trail Association can appeal to family, friends and others to pledge dollars to support their commitment on Oct. 10.

"Since five wildfires have scorched the trail and surrounding landscape this summer, we have a lot of work ahead to restore the AZT," said Nelson. "It takes a strong organization to protect and maintain 800 miles of trail. As we attempt to raise the funds necessary to sustain the ATA, please think about what your experiences on the AZT are worth."
