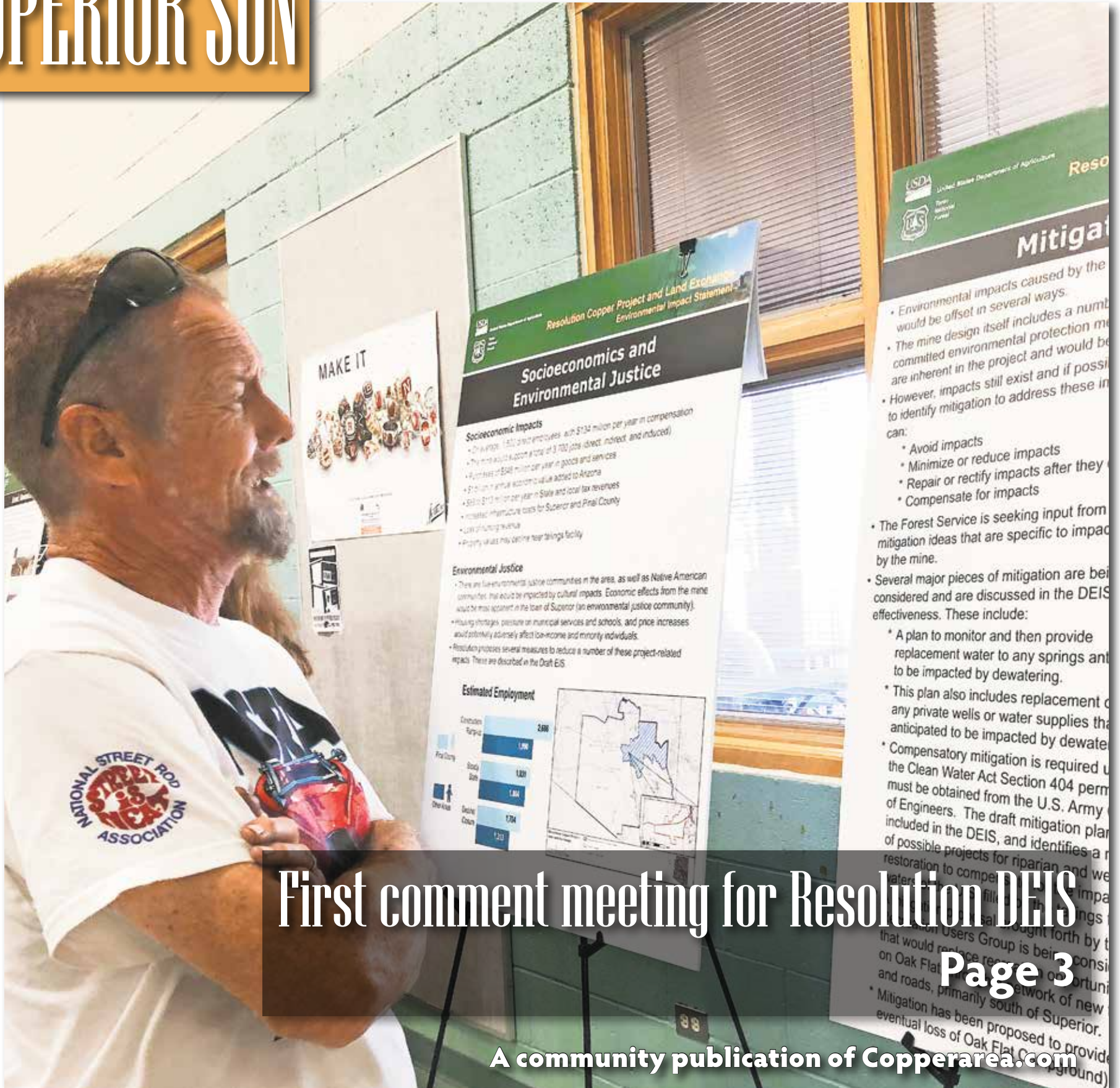
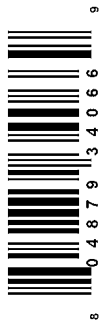

Lane closures, restrictions announced for Pinto Creek, Winkelman bridge projects

The Arizona Department of Transportation this week announced that daily lane closures on the US 60 Pinto Creek Bridge and lane restrictions on the SR 77 Gila River Bridge in Winkelman will both begin on Sept. 23.

Motorists on US 60 between Miami and Superior should expect daily lane closures for the Pinto Creek Bridge

replacement project between 7 a.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays through Thursdays and 7 a.m. to noon on Fridays.

Beginning in October, full closures of US 60 are tentatively scheduled between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. on Tuesdays and Thursdays for about eight weeks.

Flaggers will be directing traffic. Drivers should plan for delays through the work zone.

The overall project involves constructing a new bridge adjacent to the existing bridge, and then removing the

existing bridge. The project is expected to take about two years to complete.

Lane restrictions are scheduled to begin Monday, Sept. 23, on SR 77 in Winkelman as crews install temporary signals for the Gila River Bridge replacement project.

Once the new signals are in place, traffic across the bridge will be restricted to a single lane. The width limit on the bridge during construction will be 15 feet.

Motorists should expect occasional delays, especially during peak traffic hours and during scheduled closures of US 60 west of Miami for the Pinto Creek Bridge replacement project.

In addition to the lane restrictions on SR 77, Quarelli Street will be closed to traffic within the work zone.

The temporary signals will allow crews to rebuild the bridge one lane at a time.

Work is expected to continue into summer 2021.

Drivers should proceed through the work zone with caution, slow down and watch for construction personnel and equipment.

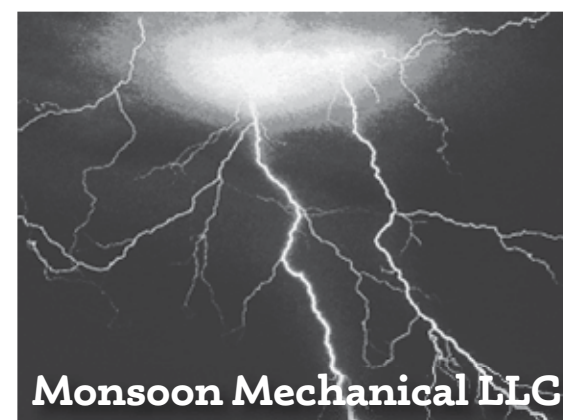

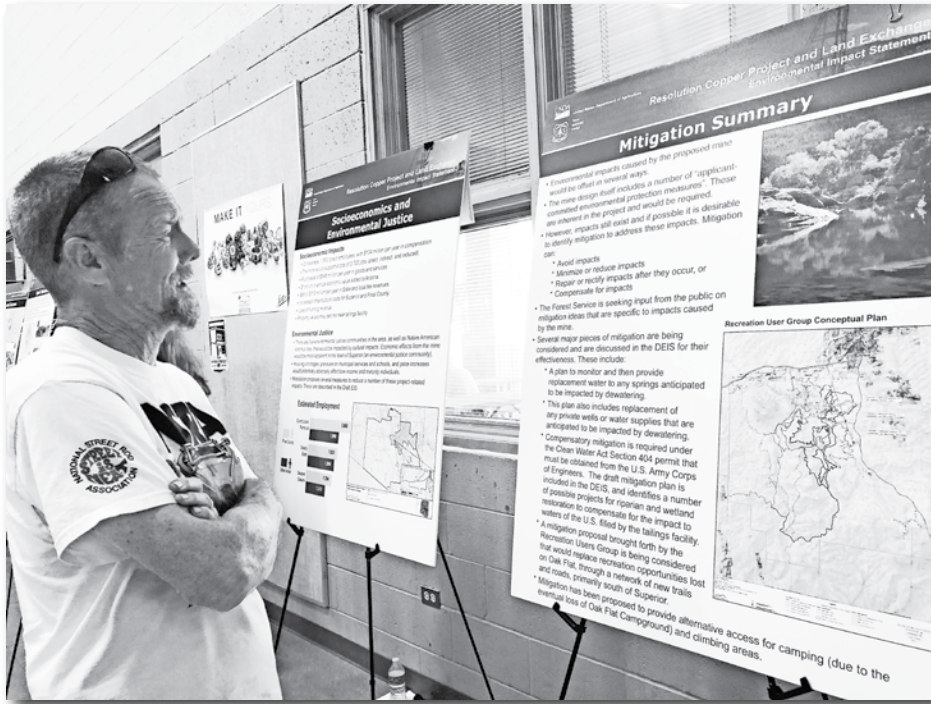

Folks from Superior attended an open house and comment meeting on the Resolution Copper Draft EIS.

First hearings held for the Resolution Copper Draft Environmental Status

The Tonto National Forest conducted the first of five public hearings regarding the Resolution Copper Draft EIS in Superior on Tuesday, Sept. 10. A second hearing was held in San Tan Valley on Sept. 12.

The public comment period began on Aug. 9, 2019 when the Tonto National Forest released the statement to the public online. This began the 90-day comment period which will end on Nov. 7, 2019.

The hearing began with an hour long sign in period and open house. During the sign in period, those wishing to make verbal comments registered and received a number. During the open house, members of the Tonto National Forest Staff and SWCA were on hand to speak to those attending. SWCA is the environmental firm that conducted the research and studies which are presented in the Draft Environmental Impact Statement.

Following the Open House the Tonto National Forest presented a 15 minute video that explained the process and presented some of the data that was found in the plan. The video can be viewed online: <http://bit.ly/ResolutionDEIS>

Superior Mayor Mila Besich briefly addressed those in attendance. She welcomed everyone to the hearing. "This is the data we have all been waiting to learn," she said. "The Town of Superior does have concerns about data surrounding water loss, recreation and socioeconomic impacts. The Council will be discussing these topics in order to develop the official comment letter."

She then invited everyone to attend the Town Council Work Session on Thursday, Sept. 12, to hear the Town's concerns and proposed mitigations.

Following Mayor Besich's comments, the Forest Service opened its official comment period. The majority of those commenting requested that the comment period be extended and many explained their hardships in attaining hard copies of the 1400 page Draft EIS document. The San Carlos Apache Tribal Elders spoke out against the destruction of the Oak Flat Campground due to the land exchange and operations of the mine.

Residents are encouraged to file their

Depleted Superior survives against Arete Prep

The defending state champion Superior football team entered last Friday's game at Arete Prep with four starters sidelined with injuries. If that wasn't challenging enough, the Panthers lost three more starters to injury during the game. But they still were able to pull off the victory in a high-scoring contest, 64 – 54.

"I am proud of the underclassmen who stepped up and did just enough to earn the victory," Superior head coach Ryan Palmer told the *Superior Sun*. "Freshmen Zach Duarte, Ben Duarte, and Richard Drennan all did a great job starting in their first game."

The result of so many injuries, several Panthers played multiple positions, including some they had never played before. Junior Matt Perez is one example, playing nose guard, defensive end, punter, defensive back, and wide receiver at various points in the second half.

"Arete Prep had four athletic trainers, and at one point,

early in the third quarter, they were all over on our sideline working on separate players," Palmer said. "Injuries are part of the game, but they almost sunk us."

"(So many) players did a great job by stepping up, playing out of position, and doing what it took to get a win."

Offensively, the Panthers were as high-octane as ever, led by sophomore quarterback Matthew Cruz, who threw for four touchdowns and rushed for two more. Gabe Otero, a senior, threw for a touchdown, caught one, and ran for another in the win. Matthew Diaz-Gonzales added rushing and receiving touchdowns. Sammy Lopez, a senior, finished with a game-high seven receptions for 163 yards and three touchdowns.

It's the Panthers' defense that is breaking down. After allowing a total of 111 points during the entire 2018 season, the Panthers have seen 94 points scored against them in just their last two games. Injuries account for a part of the break down but not all.

"We are not playing assignment football, plain and simple," Palmer explained. "Each player has a job to

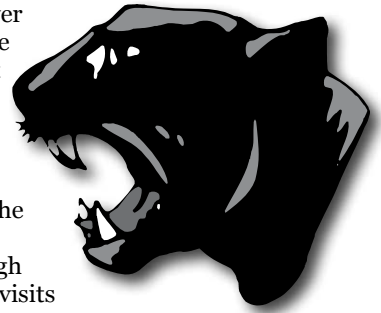
do. When just one player doesn't do their job, the entire team fails. Right now, we have way too many mental errors and not nearly enough discipline."

Whatever the cause, the Panthers need to get it fixed, and quick. A tough Mogollon team (3 – 1) visits this week.

"Mogollon is a well-coached team with some great athletes," Palmer said. "The team that plays the more disciplined game will win."

"Hopefully we get healthy and find our swagger," he added. "This team is talented; we just need to put it all together."

Up next: Home versus Mogollon this Friday, Sept. 20. Kickoff is scheduled for 7 p.m.

Superior Council discusses comments to Resolution Draft EIS, hires lobbyist

The Town of Superior last week conducted a public Town Council Work Session to discuss the Resolution Copper Draft EIS and the Town's official comments to the Draft EIS.

Town Manager Todd Pryor explained that the data in the draft document has many items that are concerning to the Town including an 18% loss of surface water flows to Queen Creek along with the loss of wells and seeps, major public safety and infrastructure impacts that are not funded.

The plan indicates that several of the main intersections in town will be impacted and will cause many traffic problems. Data surrounding the public safety needs indicate that the Town will need to double its police and fire staffing levels to accommodate the increases. At present there are no funding mechanisms that will support the need for increased investment in infrastructure and public safety. The proposed tax

revenue coming to the Town of Superior will not fund the increases for public safety or demands on infrastructure.

To mitigate the loss of water to the local aquifer, wells and surface water flows to Queen Creek, Pryor suggested that the mitigations be to deploy the Queen Creek Riparian Improvement plan that the Town approved in 2000.

"An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure," he said. By recharging the aquifer and slowing down the flow of water in Queen Creek, this would begin to repair the watershed and increase the water levels in the aquifer.

He also pointed out that the document suggests that 25% of Resolution Copper's workforce will reside in Superior. There is currently not enough housing stock in the area to accommodate the increase. Plans to build affordable and workforce housing have not been able to come into fruition because the cost to build the homes is higher than what an affordable housing rent/mortgage could be.

"This is concerning because we do not want to gentrify the community or have homes where there are too many workers living in one home," he explained.

Pryor addressed the Recreation Users Group (RUG) plan and the Castleberry Campground, mitigations for the loss of Oak Flats and other recreation areas. The Draft EIS has a section in the plan devoted to this topic but it does not mandate that Resolution Copper fund the construction and maintenance of the trail and campground. The document says a local non-profit will fund and maintain this.

He also explained that the Skunk Camp tailings alternative was the selection that the Town of Superior should advocate for, as it does not affect the waterways, recreation or view-shed of Superior.

One of the solutions that town staff is proposing to Council is the funding of an endowment by Resolution Copper to ensure that these impacts are funded in perpetuity and is not subject to management changes or sale of the mine in the future. The Council will finalize its comment letter at the October meeting and approve it as an official Town statement.

During its regular business agenda, the Council unanimously approved hiring Nexxus Consulting, a Washington D.C. lobbying firm that specializes in helping municipalities with federal legislative issues. The contract is for three months to aid the Town in managing its response and advocacy for Superior at the federal level through the Draft EIS process.

The council also approved a contract with GLHN Architects to begin the design of the Multi-Generational Center and rehab of the Roosevelt School/Town Hall. The funding for the design and rehabilitation of the existing structure is funded through a community development agreement with Resolution Copper which was approved by the council in February.

Kickstarting: Copper Corridor Blight Busters

For the past few years, the communities across the Copper Corridor along with the Copper Corridor Economic Development Coalition and the Southern Gila County Economic Development Corporation have been collaborating on ideas, policies and programs that will help to combat and alleviate blight, abandoned homes and vacancy across the region.

The CCEDC hosted a Rural by Choice Blight Forum that addressed ways to alleviate blight and address policies that actually encourage blight.

A year later the the House of Representatives Committee on Land, Agriculture and Rural Affairs met to address some of the issues facing rural communities regarding abandoned properties and tax laws that encourage blight. These forums connected the local governments to the ADEQ Brownfields programs and ACCHES health care property lien division.

The CCEDC has successfully helped many homeowners access USDA 504 home repair grants and loans. Those funds have repaired roofs, installed windows, fixed floors and helped to facilitate over \$150,000 in home repairs across the Copper Corridor. Organizations like Rebuild Superior Inc. have started paint programs for homeowners and each community has

instituted some kind of community clean up program. The synergies have been growing and working together has started to pay off of many of the entities.

The Town of Superior and Gila County have successfully utilized the Brownfields grant program with the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality to clean up properties that have been abandoned. There is a limited amount of Brownfields Funding at the state level and, with great need for blight abatement in the region, the the Towns of Superior, Miami, Kearny, Hayden, Winkelman along with the City of Globe and Pinal and Gila Counties are partnering together to apply for a federal "Regional EPA Brownfields Grant"

The Town of Winkelman hosted the kick off meeting for the Copper Corridor Blight Busters in early September. Each of the entities is expected to sign an agreement letter to join the coalition and sign an MOU. If selected the funding will be used to provide phase one and phase two environmental clean ups on properties throughout the region. Gila County has agreed to the partner agency to manage the grant and administration. The grant will be submitted in December and would be awarded in 2020.
