## Resolution Copper Land Exchange: House of Representatives expected to vote tomorrow

Resolution Copper has announced that they are expecting the United States House of Representatives to vote on the Southeast Arizona Land Exchange and Conservation Act, H.R. 687 on Thursday, Sept. 26. The legislation was introduced earlier this year by Congressional Representatives Ann Kirkpatrick (CD 1) and Paul Gosar (CD 4). This is the first time in the recent history of the legislation that there has been bipartisan support for the land exchange. Supporters of the L and

Supporters of the Land Exchange are anticipating the bill to pass through the House of Representatives. Once the bill is approved

in the House, the bill will need a hearing and vote in the Senate before reaching President Barack Obama for final approval.

The Land Exchange Legislation will allow for Resolution Copper to acquire 2,422 acres of Tonto National Forest Land which includes the Oak Flat Campground in exchange for 5,344 acres of environmentally sensitive lands in the San Pedro River Valley that the government will receive. While the bill continues to receive high levels of support, opposition groups

continue to advocate against the project.

## Asarco agrees to pay \$146,600 for PCB violations at Hayden copper smelter

SAN FRANCISCO - Late last week the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency announced that it has fined Asarco LLC \$30,900 for using buildings contaminated with PCBs and improper management of PCB waste. The company will also spend \$115,714 to reduce PCBs at their copper smelter located in Hayden, Ariz.

The violations stemmed from a 2011 inspection in which EPA inspectors found two buildings contaminated with PCBs that Asarco employees continued to use, a

violation of the federal Toxic Substances Control Act


"Exposure to PCBs is a concern whenever facilities are handling materials containing these toxic chemicals," said Jared Blumenfeld, EPA's Regional Administrator for the Pacific Southwest. "Our goal

is to safeguard worker health and nearby communities by ensuring that Asarco takes the necessary steps to improve the safety of their recycling and disposal practices." As part of the agreement, Asarco has agreed to replace three PCB transformers at the

smelter, reducing future risk of exposure to workers and the environment.

PCBs (polychlorinated biphenyls) are man-made organic chemicals used in paints, industrial equipment, plastics, and cooling oil for electrical transformers. More than 1.5 billion pounds of PCBs were manufactured in the United States before the EPA banned the production of this chemical class in 1978, and many PCB-containing materials are still in use today.

## Destiny of local parish tied to Spanish

Copper Basin News As I was gathering information for this piece I talked with Msg. Raul Trevizo, who was raised in Hayden. He described the history of St. Joseph's Parish as a trinity....The Founding, The New Church and The Remodeling. The three were equally *important to help build and* blend the parish into what it is today. This is my attempt of the trinity.

The Founding

#### Little did we know that the destiny and future of

St. Joseph in Hayden and Our Lady of Guadalupe in Winkelman were practically secure due to the misfortune of Mexico. During Mexico's turmoil in the late 1800's it began exiling Catholic priests, especially foreign priests. Missionaries started migrating to Southwest Arizona including the Carmelites of the Discalced Order from Spain.

One such priest was Fr. Pedro Heriz who arrived in Arizona in October of 1911. He was soon given authority from Bishop

Granjon of Tucson to establish a foundation of the Order in one of the towns between Mammoth-Oracle and Ray-Sonora. These were all mining communities with the majority of the populations being from Mexico. After living in Winkelman for two or three months, he decided to build a Chapel and house as the center of the new Parish in Sonora. From there he could attend to the spiritual needs of the other towns located within that area. There were small chapels already built in Winkelman, Christmas and

Mammoth.

While the adobes for the church in Sonora were being made, Fr. Pedro worked fervently visiting Hayden daily where he was preparing the First Communion children and ministering to the other needs of the Catholic faithful.

From the very beginning, Fr. Pedro had seen the importance of the town of Hayden, which in those days had a population of 2,500 inhabitants. A mile away was Winkelman with another 1,000. He felt it was of upmost importance that he build a chapel in Hayden, though it would be a temporary one.

Fr. Pedro communicated to Fr. Lucas, Provincial-vicar of Catalonia that the mining superintendent desired a Catholic chapel that would serve the needs of the miners and had offered a lot and a certain amount of money for the said construction.

Fr. Pedro had a twin brother, Fr. Pascasio, who was also a Discalced Carmelite and belonged to the Province of Navarre. He had been a missionary in English India for 14 years. Fr. Pedro asked the

Propagation of the Faith and the Provincial of Navarre for Fr. Pascasio to be incardinated into the Province of Catalonia in order to serve missions in Arizona. In January of 1913.

consent was given and in

March of the same year Fr. Pascasio arrived in Sonora and immediately left for Hayden to pick up the donations to build the new chapel.

While the chapel was being built Fr. Pascasio would celebrate two masses on Sundays, one in Hayden at 8:30 a.m. and then he would walk to Winkelman for the second mass at 10:30 a.m. When he finished it would be 12 noon.

Near the end of April, 1913, the exterior walls of the chapel were completed. The cost was \$2,850 and a few years later more space was added.

Fr. Pascasio not only took care of Hayden and, but also ministered to the people in Aravaipa, Mammoth and Oracle. In order to see to the spiritual needs of these towns, Fr. bought a horse for \$60 with a saddle and all that went with it.

He wrote in June of 1913, "At times I travel 35 miles in one stretch. At first I would get very tired, but now I'm used to it, except for the heat. It is so intense

that one feels like one is being fried. Since I've been here I have lost 12 pounds". Perhaps Fr. Pascasio became an excellent rider, but he soon bought a small four-wheel carriage which was safer for visiting the towns that were along the San Pedro and Gila Rivers. During this time the chapel was near completion and later construction began on the main church.

Fr. Basilio Delgado took charge of the Hayden Parish in July of 1914 and continued the building process. The church building would have a basement that served as the parish hall and a kitchen with the chapel being incorporated as the altar. Also built were three rooms, a bathroom, bedroom and a parlor and a Church bell was bought for the price of \$26.50.

As if he didn't have enough to do Fr. Basilio was also overseeing the building of a chapel in Superior, while still serving the various communities.

The fate of these missions took a turn in April of 1921 when the mines closed down and most of the Mexican workers returned to Mexico.

The priests at Sonora and Havden no longer resided in town. They did not return to Hayden until 1940, but the communities were still served with priests traveling the circuit out of Florence. When the priest came to town he would perform marriage, First Communions, Confirmations and bury the dead. Most old-timers told of the various priests traveling on donkeys to get from one town to the other and many would gather to receive the sacraments.

Fr. Basilio was sent to Florence but still administered to Hayden and

Winkelman until 1926 when Fr. Eliseo Costa took over the circuit. He was followed by Fr. Clement Lluent and later by Fr. Angel Esteve. In October of 1940 Fr. Andrew Bayer was appointed to the Hayden Parish as the residential priest. His successor was Fr. Amancio Manubens. Successive priest included Fr. Juan M Paradero, Fr. Albert Balcells, Fr. John Marti and then again Fr. Albert Balcells. Fr. Patrick Perjes took over in September of 1966 and served until July of 1971. Fr. Alex Machain, a Secular Priest came to Hayden in July of 1971 and was instrumental in getting the drive going for The New

Church. Fr. Pedro left the area in 1914 and went on to serve 22 years of serious work in the Diocese of Tucson. He returned to Spain as Novice Master of the Barcelona Province. This saintly priest was murdered by the Communists in Tarragons, Spain in November of

Many weddings took place at St. Joseph's.

1936 at the age of 77. He is currently being considered for beatification as a martyr. In the meantime, the chapel in Winkelman was to become the Our Lady of Guadalupe Mission and work on the building began in 1923. Parishioners donated labor and some money and helped with fund raising projects. Abobe



## Bearcats rout

By Richard Bravo Copper Basin News The fourth ranked Ray Bearcats remained undefeated as they routed their rival Hayden Lobos 48-14 Friday night in front of a packed house at Dave Mcfee Memorial stadium. The Bearcats started the scoring in the first quarter as Joe Rudy Lorona gave the Bearcats the point lead as he scrambled 5 vards for the first score of the game. The two point conversion by Dominic Bravo put the 'Cats up 8-0 early in the game. After being held to no yards



on their second offensive possession the Lobos were forced to punt from deep in their own territory. A bad snap on the attempt gave the Bearcats the ball in excellent field possession and on the very next play the 'Cats extended the lead on a 5-vard end around by wide receiver Bravo. A successful two point conversion by quarterback Destry Yocum put the cats up 16-0 at the end of one quarter of play.

The start of the second quarter of play began the same way as the first. It ended with the Bearcats finding the end zone as the cats drove 68 yards down the field, capping the drive on a 20-yard run by Lorona for his second touchdown of the game. The two point conversion by running back Nick Lara gave the cats a 24-0 lead with 10:54 left in the first half. The Lobos responded half way through the quarter as Lobo running back Aaron Lagunas ran 24 vards for the Lobos first score of the game. The two point conversion cut the Bearcat lead to 16. With time winding down in the first half the Bearcats went to the air as Yocum connected with receiver Seth Harmon on a 21-yard touchdown pass. The Bearcats completed the two point conversion giving them a commanding 32-8 lead at the half. Both teams came out in the third quarter

exchanging possessions as both teams went scoreless heading into the final quarter of play.

With the score still 32-8 in at the start of the fourth quarter Bearcat quarterback Yocum capped a 9 play 60-yard drive as he ran the ball from 10 yards out. Paul Michael Wormwood added two points on the conversion attempt giving the 'Cats a 40-8 lead with 11:54 remaining in the game. After a turnover on downs by the Lobos on their ensuing possession the 'Cats put the game out of reach as Yocum scored his second rush touchdown of the game on an 8-yard run. Yocum connected with Harmon on the two point conversion giving the Bearcats a 48-8 lead with 8:17 left in the fourth quarter. The Lobos tried to mount a comeback as running back Lagunas broke free for a 50-yard touchdown but with time winding down the Lobos came up short. The clock hit zeros and the Bearcats rolled to a 48-14 homecoming victory. Leading the offense was




Yocum who found the end zone three times, rushing for two and passing for another. Yocum was the leading rusher as he carried the ball 10 times for 130 yards. Lorona rushed twice for 34 yards and two touchdowns. Bravo added one rush for 5 yards and a touchdown.

Defensively Bravo led with six tackles and an interception. Yocum, Wormwood, and Ryan Bickley each had four tackles. Harmon and Jacob pace had three tackles each. The Bearcats travel to Ft. Thomas this Friday to try to extend their winning streak to five in a row. Game time is 7 p.m. Good Luck Bearcats!

## Lobos lose to Bearcats

The Ray team behind the scrambling of their quarterback coupled with the poor tackling Lobos soon were in scoring position punching the football over the goal line at 6:44 of the opening quarter and scored the points after for a 0 to 8 lead. It did not take long for Ray to score again holding the Lobo offense forcing a punt. On the punt attempt, the snap sailed over the punters head finally recovered at the Lobo nine yard line. out on the first quarter.



The Ray offense controlled the rest of the half taking the kick-off at the 41 yard line driving down the field scoring with 47 left to take an 8 to 32 lead as the half came to an end.

The third quarter was what many people expected in the game, with each defense team taking turns stopping the opponent's offense. Neither team scored but Ray had a drive going late in the third quarter finally scoring early in the fourth quarter on an eight yard run to increase the lead to 8 to 40 lead at 11:56 of the quarter.

The Lobos took the kick off, could not move the chains and punted. It took Ray four plays to score their final touchdowns, a 13 yard

run and the two points gave them a 8 to 48 lead at 8:17 of the fourth. The Lobos did not give up. They took the kick off, started to drive only to lose the ball on a pass interception. The Lobo defense held, taking over on downs. On the third Lobo offensive play, Lagunas took the football on a reverse play fifty yards for a TD. ORDINANCE NO. 13-193 AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF KEARNY, PINAL COUNTY, ARIZONA, AMENDING SECTION 10-1-9, MINORS CURFEW ESTABLISHING AN EFFECTIVE DATE: DOU/IDING FOR SEVERABILITY PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY AND PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS. BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF KEARNY ARIZONA: Section 1: That the Kearny Town Code Section 10-1-9, Minors, Curfew is hereby amended as follows: A. Except as set forth below, it is unlawful for any person under eighteen(18) years of age to be upon any of the streets, alleys or public places in the own between the hours of ten (10::00) o'clock p.m. And five (5:00) o'clock a.m., unless such person is accompanied by a parent, guardian, adult relative or an adult friend approved by a parent or guardian, unless such person is attending to employment or urgent business. If such unaccompanied minor is upon any of the streets, alleys or public places, between the hours stated above, and is attending to a school function, employment or urgent business, for which he or she can give a satisfactory explanation, it is unlawful for that minor to loiter, linger or ride aimlessly about the town. Such persons must transact such urgent business as speedily as possible. B. It is unlawful for the parent or guardian of a person under the age of eighteen (18) years to permit such a minor to be upon any of the streets, alleys or public places in town between the hours of ten (10:00) o'clock p.m. and five (5:00) o'clock a.m. The provisions of this section do not apply when the minor is accompanied by a parent, guardian, adult relative or an adult friend approved by a parent or guardian, or if such person is attending a school function, employment or urgent business and can give a satisfactory account of why he is absent from home It shall not constitute a defense that such parent or guardian did not have knowledge of the whereabouts of the minor. C. Curfew is extended until 11:30 p.m. on Friday and Saturday, for minors age sixteen (16) and seventeen(17). D. The Town shall activate a curfew siren at ten (10:00) o'clock p.m. This shall constitute prima facie evidence that curfew is in effect with the Town. Section 2. Any person found guilty of violating any provision of this Ordinance to the shall be guilty of a class one misdemeanor. Each day that a violation continues shall be a separate offense punishable as herein above describe. Section 3: If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance adopted herein by reference is for any reason held to be invalid or unconstitutional by the decision of any court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions thereof. Section 4: The provisions of Section 1 through 3 of this ordinance shall be effective from and after November 1, 2013. 
