In addition to driving his great-grandchildren around on their paper routes for years,

George was actively involved in Pinal County 4-H for many years, and served on its Board of Directors for several years. When he was younger, he was a member of the Lions Club. He was also a volunteer police officer in Kearny.

George loved baseball, especially the Diamondbacks. He loved and enjoyed life.

He was gentle, kind and compassionate to everyone. George was truly the rock of the family. He never lost his smile and rarely complained; he just went on with the flow of life and made the best of every situation.

Services were held on Sat., Sept. 21, at the First Baptist Church in Oracle.

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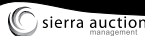
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PCSO issues sex offender notification for the Oracle area

The Pinal County Sheriff's Office has issued a sex offender notification for the Oracle area.

Steven Anthony Burgess, 45, who resides in the 1200 block of E. Aldwinkle Place, Oracle, has been classified as a level three sex offender. He is 5 feet, 6 inches tall, 160 pounds with black hair and brown eyes. He has a tattoo on his back of a ribbon with the words "Brown Pride."

He pleaded guilty in a plea agreement in 1987 to attempted sexual assault after sexually assaulting a 12 year old female who was known to him. He pleaded guilty in a plea agreement in 2000 to attempted molestation of a child after molesting an 11

year old female who was known to him.

The Pinal County Sheriff's Office is releasing the above information pursuant to A.R.S. 13-3825, the Community Notification on Sex Offender Law. Notification must be made when certain sex offenders are released from the Arizona State Prison, accepted under an interstate compact or released from the county jail back into the community.

Offenders are categorized into three levels: Level One (low risk to the community), Level Two (intermediate risk to the community), and Level Three (high risk to the community).

The individuals who appear on this notification have been

convicted of a sex offense, which allows for community notification. They are not wanted by the Pinal County Sheriff's Office at this time.

This notification is not intended to increase fear; rather it is our belief that an

informed community is a safer community. The Pinal County Sheriff's Office has no legal authority to direct where a sex offender may or may not live. Unless court ordered restrictions exist, this offender is constitutionally free to live

wherever he chooses. Citizen abuse of this information to threaten, intimidate, or harass sex offenders will not be tolerated. Sex offenders have always lived in our communities; but because of Megan's Law, law

enforcement is now able to share this information with you.

Police caution that any use of this information to threaten, intimidate, harass or create an act against another person will result in prosecution.

Resolution Copper Land Exchange: House of Representatives expected to vote tomorrow

Resolution Copper has announced that they are expecting the United States House of Representatives to vote on the Southeast Arizona Land Exchange and Conservation Act, H.R. 687 on Thursday, Sept. 26.

The legislation was introduced earlier this year by Congressional Representatives Ann

Kirkpatrick (CD 1) and Paul Gosar (CD 4). This is the first time in the recent history of the legislation that there has been bipartisan support for the land exchange.

Supporters of the Land Exchange are anticipating the bill to pass through the House of Representatives. Once the bill is approved

in the House, the bill will need a hearing and vote in the Senate before reaching President Barack Obama for final approval.

The Land Exchange Legislation will allow for Resolution Copper to acquire 2,422 acres of Tonto National Forest Land which includes the

Oak Flat Campground in exchange for 5,344 acres of environmentally sensitive lands in the San Pedro River Valley that the government will receive. While the bill continues to receive high levels of support, opposition groups continue to advocate against the project.



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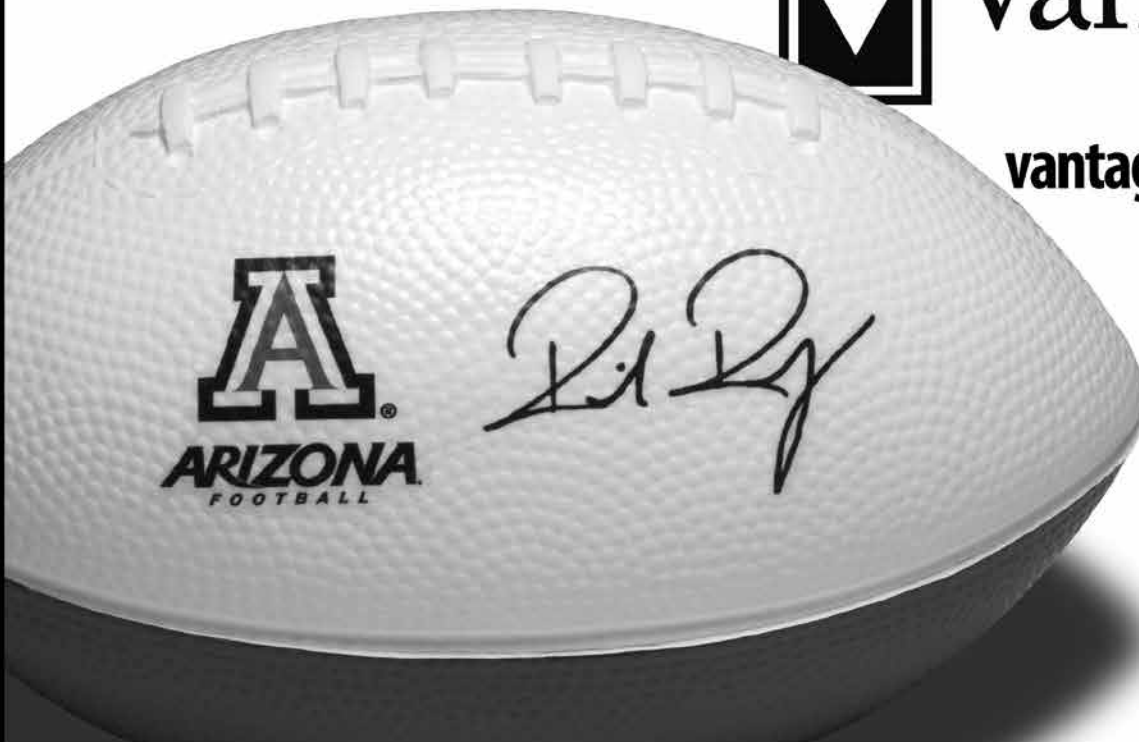
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Miners get first win; shut out Eagles 37 – 0

The San Manuel varsity football team got its first win of

the season by shutting out the visiting Imagine Prep Eagles 37 – 0.

Imagine Prep is a new charter

school out of Coolidge and started the game with only 11 players suited up. An injury to an Eagles player midway through the second quarter left Imagine Prep with only 10 players on the field. The referees and coaches conferred on the field, deciding to continue the game with 10 players on each side of the ball during play; they also agreed to run the clock – only stopping on injuries and time outs.

In the third quarter, another player was injured for the Eagles forcing a stoppage in play, leaving only nine players on the field for the Eagles. The referees and the coaches conferred once again, making the call to end the game for the safety of the Imagine Prep players. The Eagles showed a lot of heart – knowing they went in short handed.

In the first quarter, the Miners scored on their first drive of the night. San Manuel began the drive at their own 47 yard line and scored four plays later as running back Ben Quijada ran the ball in to the end zone from 15 yards out for the touch-

down, the point after touch-down kick was good by Anthony Garcia for a 7 – 0 lead with 8:13 on the clock. The Miners drove 53 yards in four plays, taking 2:05 on the drive.

The Miners defense would get into the scoring column on the next drive for the Eagles when Imagine Prep was backed up at their own 11 yard line facing a third down and four yards to go – the center for the Eagles snapped the ball over the quarterbacks head with it sailing into the end zone where linebacker Armando Sierra recovered the ball for the touch-down. The PAT kick by Garcia was good for a 14 – 0 Miner lead with 7:23 showing on the clock in the first quarter.

The Eagles punted the ball away after going three and out on their next possession; the Miners also gave up the ball as they turned it over on downs.

San Manuel's defense got on the scoreboard once again as Imagine Prep were on their own six yard line where defensive back Richard Romo tackled the ball carrier in the end zone for a safety picking

up two points in the process for the Miners. The score was now 16 – 0 in favor of the Miners with 3:49 on the clock in the first quarter.

With the safety pinned against the Eagles, they would now have to kick off to the Miners from their own 20 yard line; return-man Daniel Medina was back deep for the Miners. The ball landed into the arms of Medina as he hit 'Pay Dirt' 70 yards later returning the punt for a touchdown. The PAT kick was good by Garcia for a 23 – 0 Miners lead with 3:36 left in the first quarter.

In the second quarter, on the next possession for the Eagles, the offense was able to sustain a viable drive that would end on a fourth down and 15 to go – the Eagles attempted a fake punt that fell short.

The Miners would take over at their own 48 yard line and give up the ball on the first play of the drive on a fumble.

Imagine Prep took possession at the San Manuel 30 yard line and march the ball down

to the Miners 15 yard line, on a fourth and 15 to go – safety Daniel Medina stepped in on Eagles pass, intercepting the ball and returning it 78 yards down field to the Imagine Prep 20 yard line.

This would set up the Miners at the 20 yard line, the first play of the drive went to running back Anthony Garcia who picked up five yards on the play to the 15 yard line. On the second play of the drive, Garcia got the call again and plowed his way into the end zone for the touchdown from 15 yards out; the PAT kick by Garcia was good for a 30 – 0 lead for the Miners with 8:06 on the clock in the second quarter. San Manuel drove 20 yards in two plays taking 1:00 on the drive. An Eagles player was injured on the touchdown play – the clock would now begin to run the rest of the game and both teams would field 10 players in the game.

The Eagles gave up the ball on downs on their next drive –

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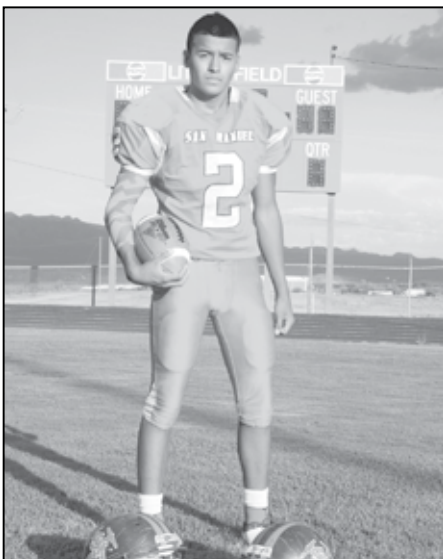
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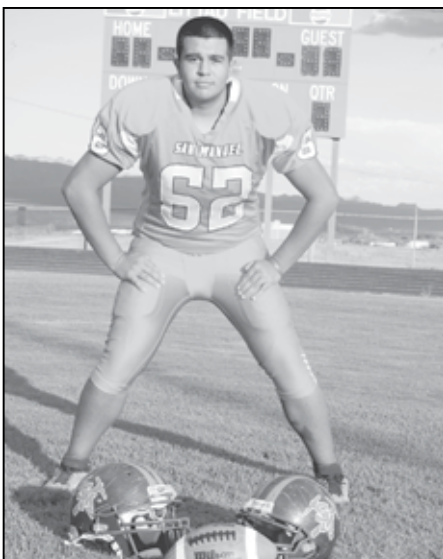

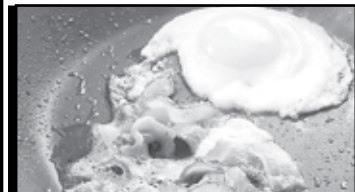
