Fabian Elvira led the offense throwing 8-12, with 295 yards of passing, 24 yards of rushing, with 4 touchdowns and 2 interceptions. Issac Castillo led the receiving group with 3 receptions for 113 yards and 2 touchdowns. Brandon Garner had 3 receptions for 97 yards, and 1 touchdown. JJ Manriquez had 1 reception for 30 yards and 1 touchdown. Moraes Cruz had 1 reception for 55 yards.

The ground attack was led by Moraes Cruz with 8 carries, 56 yards, and 2 touchdowns, followed by his partner Deondre Collier who had 8 carries for 53 yards and 1

touchdown. Tyler Garner had 1 carry for 4 yards. The Lobos had 432 total yards for this game.

Defense once again played strong, not allowing Tempe Prep's offense to score. Keiston Pool had 7 tackles and 1 assist. Kino Lorona had 6 tackles, 3 assist, and 1 interception. Rene Ochoa had 5 tackles and 1 assist. Julian Cruz had 5 tackles. Moraes Cruz had 2 tackles, 2 assists, and 1 interception which he returned for a 100-yard touchdown. Dominic Alvarado had 2 tackles, and 1 fumble recovery. Deondre Collier had 2 tackles and many pass deflections. Brandon Garner had 1 tackle with many pass deflections. Mark Acevedo had 1 sack, and 1 assist. Andrew Waddell had 1 tackle, and 1 forced fumble. Izzy Gallego and Mathew Armenta had 1 tackle each.

On Friday Sept. 30, the Lobos will take on the Dishchii'bikoh Wildcats at home with a kickoff time of 7

p.m. This will be Hayden's homecoming game. There will be a parade prior to the game and all the halftime festivities.
