

# World Music in the Desert, coming soon to the Boyce Thompson Arboretum

At the end of October, the southwestern desert will be transformed into a world music oasis. Playing at the Boyce Thompson Arboretum in Superior will be Traveler, bringing their own unique blend of World Fusion music. "Traveler was created from a dream," bandleader and composer, Scott Jeffers, says of the Traveler project. "A dream of what music could be if there were no boundaries."

No boundaries mean the freedom to use a blend of ethnic sounds, experimental vocal techniques, and an underlying rock beat, which allows the music of Traveler to connect with people on a deeper level. Inspired by their many

travels across the globe, and using exotic instruments collected from faraway places, Traveler brings the sights and sounds of distant lands to their audience.

"We want to take [our audience] on a journey," Scott says when describing what a Traveler show is all about. 
Estrella is preceded in death by her grandparents, Mr. and Mrs. Estrada, and her grandfather, Mr. Vera,


