U.S. Census Bureau announces the start of first major field operation for 2020 Census

The U.S. Census Bureau late last month briefed the media on the launch of address canvassing, the first major field operation of the 2020 Census. Address canvassing improves and refines the Census Bureau's address list of households nationwide, which is necessary to deliver invitations to respond to the census. The address list plays a vital role in ensuring a complete and accurate count of everyone living in the United States.

"The Census Bureau is dedicated to ensuring that we are on track, and ready to accomplish the mission of the 2020 Census," said Census Bureau Director Steven Dillingham. "We have made many improvements and innovations over the past decade, including better technologies for canvassing neighborhoods and developing complete and updated address listings and maps."

The Census Bureau created new software called the Block Assessment, Research and Classification Application (BARCA). It compares satellite images of the United States over time, allowing Census Bureau employees to spot new housing developments, changes in existing homes and other housing units that did not previously exist. Reviewers also use BARCA to compare the number of housing units in current imagery with the number of addresses on file for each block.

"We were able to verify 65% of addresses using satellite

imagery — a massive accomplishment for us," said Census Bureau Geography Division Chief Deirdre Bishop during the briefing. "In 2010 we had to hire 150,000 people to verify 100% of the addresses in the field, this decade we will only have to hire about 40,000 employees around the nation to verify the remaining 35% of addresses."

Census Bureau employees (listers) have started walking through neighborhoods across the country checking addresses not verified using BARCA software. In-field address canvassing will continue through mid-October.

To help identify address listers, employees will have

badges and briefcases indicating their affiliation with the Census Bureau. They will knock on doors and ask a few simple questions to verify the address and any additional living quarters on the property for inclusion in the census. Employees will introduce themselves as a Census Bureau employee, show their official government ID badge, and explain the purpose of the visit. People may also ask them for a picture ID from another source to confirm their identity.

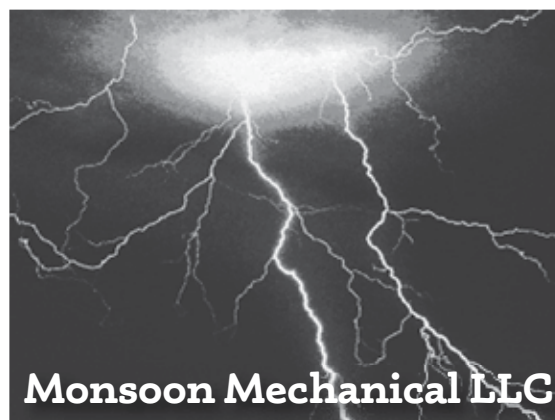

Superior to get LED light upgrade

Last year APS notified the Town of Superior that APS (and the rest of the industry) will no longer support the town's incandescent streetlights. This leaves the town no choice but to upgrade to LED. On the bright side (pun intended), LEDs are significantly cheaper to operate (\$25,000 or so less a year), and the upgrade cost of approximately \$187,000 should pay for itself in under eight years. There are 417 lights in town that must be replaced.

This year the Town of Superior has received a one-time payment from the Highway Users Revenue Fund of \$197,000 through legislation sponsored by Representative Cook. This will allow the town to make this upgrade without incurring any debt, and the savings on utilities will allow us to spend an additional \$25,000 each year on streets maintenance.

The lights function and look a little different than the old lights. They will be brighter, but they will radiate less. This should mean that the street in front of your house is brighter, but that it will not shine as much into your yard and your windows. Many people feel that the LEDs are too bright, so to give our citizens the ability to request adjustments, the new lights will be "smart," allowing us to decrease the illumination on specific streetlights by up to 50%. This will also allow us to decrease the illumination for special events, such as the Fourth of July fireworks, or to maintain our dark skies and beautiful starscapes.

The work is being completed by PLG, and you might have seen their trucks completing an audit

of all of the streetlights. That audit is complete, and they have spent the last month designing the

illumination patterns of the lights. The next phase will be the installation of the new lights. This

will begin on the US 60 corridor in the next few weeks and continue for two months until every

light in town is replaced. The project should be completed by early December.

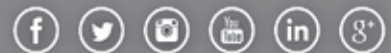

Resolution Copper to discuss water loss and other mitigation

The Superior Community Working Group (CWG) will meet on Wednesday, Sept. 11, to hear about Resolution Copper Mining's plans to reduce impacts of the mining project on water resources and to discuss the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) for the project. The CWG meeting will be held at the Superior Chamber of Commerce from 6-8 p.m.

The CWG includes residents and stakeholders from the Town of Superior, Queen Valley, Hewitt Station, Globe,

Kearny, Winkelman, Hayden, the San Carlos Community and around the area. The group deals with the social and environmental issues, science and policy, and the pros and cons of the proposed Resolution Copper Project. Topics include environmental impacts, health, safety, natural resource issues, engineering, water quantity and quality, geology, economics, air quality, community investments, recreational changes and other related subjects.

Meetings are usually held at the Superior Chamber of

Commerce at 165 W. Main St. in Superior from 6-8 p.m., most often on the second Wednesday of each month. The public is welcome, and time is reserved on the agenda for everyone's comments, questions, and discussion.

Viewer provides county information on areas that listers will visit.

This operation is one of several activities the Census Bureau conducts for an accurate and complete count. The Census Bureau also partners with the U.S. Postal Service and tribal, state and local officials to update the address list.

"Ultimately, the success of the census depends on everyone's participation," said Marilyn Sanders, Chicago regional director. "And it's important to remember, when you respond to the census you shape your future and the future of your community."

The 2020 Census officially starts counting people in January 2020 in remote Toksook Bay, Alaska. Following the count of people in remote Alaska,

most households in the country will start receiving invitations to respond online, by phone or by mail in March 2020.

The U.S. Constitution mandates that a census of the population be conducted once every 10 years. Census data is used to determine the number of seats each state holds in Congress and how more than \$675 billion in federal

funds are distributed back to states and local communities every year for services and infrastructure, including health care, jobs, schools, roads and businesses.

The Town of Kearny will receive sealed Bids at the Town of Kearny, Town Hall, 912-C Tilbury Drive, Kearny, Arizona, 85137, telephone number, 520-363-5547, or questions for aflores@townofkearny.com, until 5:00 p.m., MST on Tuesday, September 17, 2019, when all Bids that have been duly received will be opened publicly. The project includes, but not necessarily limited to the following items of work:

105 acres of mechanical clearing of salt cedar in Kearny, Arizona. All six parcels are contiguous and treatment acres are located near the Gila River, but outside the active river channel. Treatment areas will occur on areas of dry sand, not in saturated soil. The overall scope of work of the project is to conduct mechanical fuels reduction treatments on six Town of Kearny parcels. Parcels range in size from just over 5 acres to 46 acres. Typical fuels on these parcels are mostly composed of native mesquite and non-native salt cedar along the Gila River floodplain.

Mechanical treatment will be grubbing done by using a dozer or front-end loader to uproot and push salt cedar trees out of the ground. Mastication will be done by machine, with a grinder implement to break up the trees and roots into mulch. The contractor should attempt to remove approximately 100 percent of salt cedar within the project boundary, taking care to ensure mastication and grubbing does not disrupt critical infrastructure within the boundary. Operations are expected to leave approximately 2-4 inches of wood chips from mastication on the ground in masticated areas, which will help with soil stability. One quote will be given as a standalone for the total 105 acres of the project block and the contractor shall provide all necessary equipment to complete the project. Project work will be completed by 2-11-20.
