Tough loss for Bearcats in first home match

It was a hard loss for the Bearcats as they hosted their first game of the season.

Last Friday, Sept. 2, the Ray High School football team hosted Joseph City. The game started with Joseph City getting a 6-point lead in the first quarter. The second quarter of the game saw the Bearcats trying to catch up, but the first half ended with a 6-12 score. During the third quarter, the boys closed the point gap to only a 5-point difference, with the score being 14-19 at the end of the

third. The final quarter saw the Bearcats continue to try and close the score gap, but they were unable to do so in the end. The game ended with a 20-39 final score, sending Joseph City home with the win.

“There were some good and bad takeaways from Friday night’s game,” began head coach Jay Wernett. “We have to focus on doing the little things better and more consistently, if we want to be successful. This week we will focus on fixing the little things and attention to detail. We had 13 penalties, 3 turnovers and too many mental mistakes. We have to focus on addressing those issues if we want to be successful.”

Standing out on the field was Hunter Day, who rushed for 228 yards and had 3 touchdowns. Mark Chester also had 3 carries for 36 yards. Chris Curiel stepped in at QB due to injuries with limited reps. Defensively, Hunter Day led the team with 11 total tackles; Gaje Nichols had 10 total tackles; Blake Ortiz, Joseph Morales and Jon Beede all had 8 total tackles; and Mark Chester had an interception during a critical point in the game.

The Bearcats will travel to Superior on Friday, Sept. 9, with a kickoff time of 7 p.m. for the annual Copper Helmet game. Go out and support your Bearcat football team!

On Friday, Sept. 2, the Mogollon Mustangs came riding into Hayden, boasting two back-to-back state titles, and a 23-game winning streak. Our Lobos broke that streak.

The Friday night lights shined on Lalo A. Serrano Stadium, as the Lobos prepared to go to battle with the division's toughest team. The first quarter of the game proved to be a nail-biter with a 0-0 score board. The defensive team played hard, and hit harder, allowing a high scoring team like Mogollon to only score 6 points by the half, while the Lobos were able to score 28 points.

Deondre Collier had 5 carries for 60 yards, and was preparing for a big game but was injured during the first half.

The second half of the game saw Mogollon trying to catch up with the Lobos, but the boys were able to keep them at a distance. In the end, the Lobos walked away with their heads held high, defeating the Mustangs with a final score of 42-34.

Leading offense was the duo of Fabian Elvira and Brandon Garner Jr. Elvira had 19 complete passes with 27 attempts, with 417 yards of passing, and 6 touchdowns. Garner had 10 catches, 275 yards of receiving and 5 touchdowns. Other receivers were Isaac Castillo with 6 catches, and 81 yards; Keiston Pool with 1 catch, 22 yards,

and 1 touchdown; Jordan Rodriguez had 1 catch, and 24 yards; and Moraes Cruz had 1 catch and 16 yards.

On defense there was Rene Ochoa with 8 tackles and 1 assist; Jando Lorona with 3 tackles, 2 assists, and 2 sacks; Moraes Cruz had 4 tackles with 1 interception; Keiston Pool had 2 tackles with 1 assist; Brandon Garner Jr. had 5 tackles; Dominic Alvarado had 3 tackles, 2 assists, 2 sacks, 1 forced fumble, and 1 fumble recovery; Mark Acevedo had 2 tackles, 3 assists, and 2 sacks; Deondre Collier had 1 tackle, and 1 assist; Julian Cruz had 4 tackles; Isaac Castillo had 5 tackles; Jeremy Aguirre had 1 tackle; and Kino Lorona had 1 tackle.


