Kearny Fire Department receives new truck from Tempe

The Kearny Volunteer Fire Department received a fire truck donated to them by the City of Tempe Fire Medical Rescue Department. Deputy Chief Andrea Glass came to Kearny for the presentation. The Town Council voted to accept the truck at the Council meeting held on Wednesday September 2. They thanked Chief Glass and the City of Tempe for the donation.

The truck is a Saulsbury Pumper with a 500 gallon water tank and 1,250 gallons per minute (gpm) pumper. Included with the truck was 1,200 feet of brand new 2 1/2 inch hose, a full complement of ladders including a 24 foot and a 14 foot ladder as well as an attic ladder.

Corso resigns; Sgt. Blue remains Kearny Interim Chief

The Town of Kearny held a special town council meeting to address the investigation of Chief Richard Corso last week. Corso resigned his position with the Kearny Police Department stating on Facebook that he was not willing to work as an officer under Sgt. Dave Blue. The Council voted to keep Sgt. Blue as the interim Police chief at this time.

Corso took to Facebook earlier in the week sharing the outcome of his investigation that was conducted by the Department of Public Safety. Normally these outcomes are kept private to protect both parties, however the subject of the investigation chose to share them publicly on social media.

There were six allegations brought forward on Corso, some of which were supported by DPS. Those allegations were: alcohol abuse, unable to perform job duties, failure to follow directions from a supervisor, engaging in behavior that brings discredit to the town. Other allegations that were not supported were: making threats against the Town Manager, Mayor and council, releasing protected information shared in executive session, hiring new employees without going through the Town Manager.

Kearny Police Department Moves On After Corso Resignation

The resignation of Interim Chief Richard Corso was accepted by Town Council last week. Sergeant Dave Blue of the Department of Public Safety was named as the new interim, and will continue under the program offered the Town of Kearny by DPS.

This has been a contentious time for all of us, and the pain of many people should be acknowledged. I hope that healing will emerge. I am confident that the Kearny Police Department will come out of this as a strengthened force, and I thank everyone in the department for going about their protective work so well.

This past week included the gift of a fire truck to the Town of Kearny from the City of Tempe. This has been in the works for almost a year. The truck is not new, but is newer than our current truck. The gift means that we not only have two working trucks, but our insurance rating for the whole town is improved.

The new truck is a 5,000 gallon pumper. Tempe refitted the truck before giving it to us. It has new hoses and fittings, and Tempe's Fire Department also gave us some new turnout gear for our volunteer fire fighters.

The Copper Basin Chamber also got approval to hold its first Swap Meet on Saturday, Sept. 19. This could develop into a great Copper Basin event. Angela Hillan Ramirez, chamber director, came up with this idea and, with the help of others, is bringing it into reality.

Janet Danilow, town librarian, announced that every Tuesday and Thursday at the Kearny Library, from 8:30 a.m. to about 10 a.m., coffee and conversation will take place at the library in a program aimed at residents 50 years of age and older. All the resources of the library will

After a season-opening win at Arete Prep, the Lobos were defeated last week by seventh-ranked Valley Union, 56 – 6.

Running back Brandon Cruz rushed for 76 yards and scored Hayden's lone touchdown in the loss at Valley Union. Ryan Donovan added 90 rushing yards on offense and led the Lobos defensively with seven tackles

and an interception. John Henry Ganoa finished with seven tackles and Noah Monroy ended with eight on the night.

For the first time in several years, the much-improved Lobos are giving their fans something to be excited about, including Friday's rivalry game versus Ray.

Jr. Bearcats off to good start

The Ray Jr. High football team opened its season on Aug. 25 prepared to take to advantage of their quickness and aggressiveness against opposing teams.

Only the weather could stop the Jr. Cats in their opener at San Carlos as the game was postponed after only one quarter of play to due inclement weather. Ray was leading 8 – 0 when play was halted and will be continued at a later date.

The Cats entered the game with 21 players on the roster, including nine returners but only two of them were starters a year ago.

"We had problems executing on both sides of the ball," head coach Frank Lechuga told the *Copper Basin News*. "Our inexperience showed up, but the kids worked through the problems together and were able to hold the Braves scoreless with a good defensive effort."

The Jr. Cats hosted Mountain Vista in their home opener on September 1 and earned their first win of the season,

defeating the Cougars 24 – 8.

Alex Bravo scored the Jr. Cats first touchdown of the game and Jando Felix converted the two-point conversion to give Ray an early 8 – 0 lead.

The Jr. Cats' defense accounted for the next two scores of the game. First, Christian Day's quarterback sack in the end zone resulted in a safety to make it 10 – 0 and then Allen Martinez recovered a fumble in the end zone for a touchdown to make it 16 – 0.

Ray increased their lead in the fourth quarter on a 40-yard touchdown run by Eric Manriquez, making it 24 – 0. The play started poorly on a bad snap, but quarterback Derek Figueroa was able to recover and executed the pitch to Manriquez; ultimately making the play a success.

"Offensively we ran the ball well with Eric Manriquez and Alex Bravo," Lechuga said. "Quarterbacks Jando Felix and Derek Figueroa did well in executing the offense as well as also running the ball. Defensively Christian Day was able to get pressure in the back field all game with 4 sacks and Johnny Chester came up with 2 interceptions at cornerback."

Ray will travel to Superior for its next game on Wednesday, Sept. 9.

Kickoff is scheduled for 6 p.m.

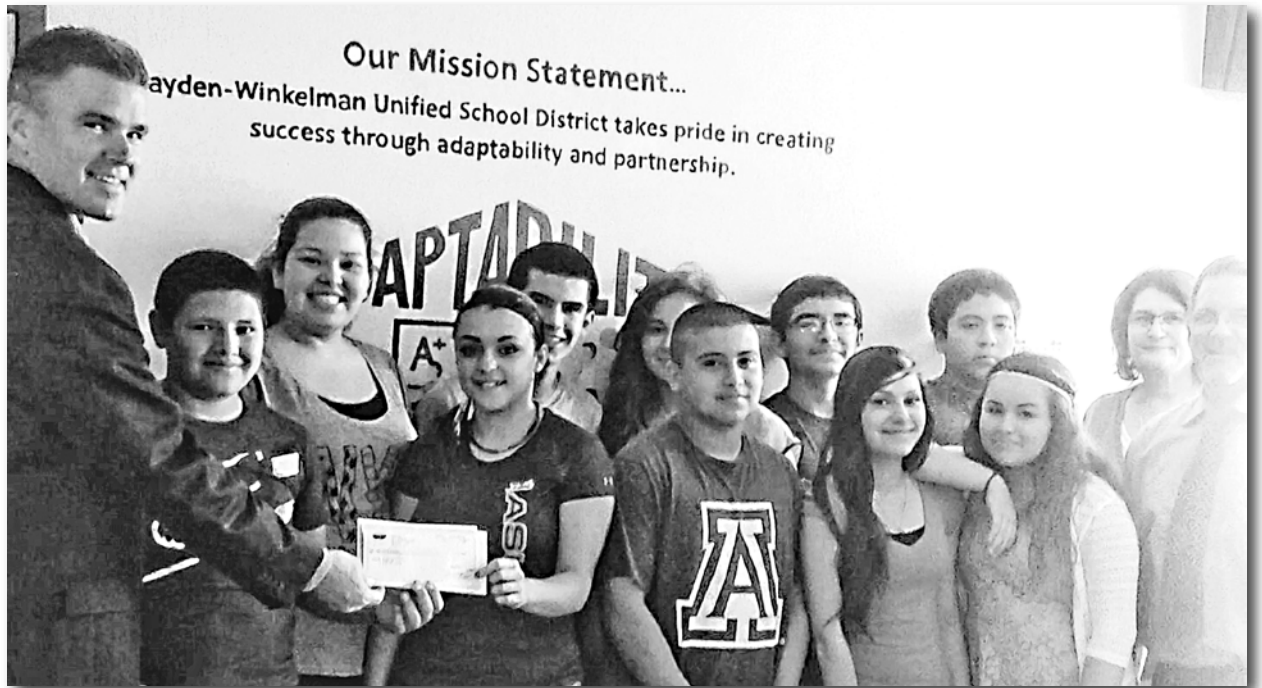

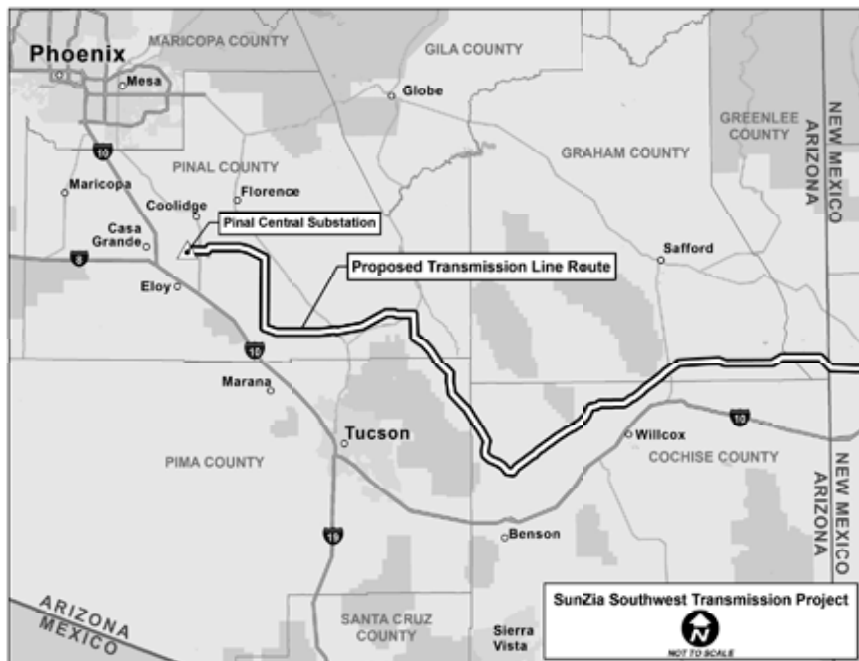
